Parish Insight

FROM “FAMILY TIME” TO “FAMILY FAITH FORMATION”

As our parish approaches its 100th anniversary, several long-time parishioners have been reminiscing about changes that have come about in the past decades, especially in the area of religious education for our children.

Kris Kolevar, who is now on staff as the operations manager, remembers the days in the mid-1990s when many parents came together to share their time, plus their creativity, and love of the faith. The parents had a strong desire to create a family ministry that included learning for parents, too.

“It was not just a drop-off time for children,” says Cherie Donze, an early organizer. “People wanted something here at St. Mary’s instead of having to bring their children to other parishes to prepare for the sacraments.”

Initial sessions were more of a “pop-up” format led by parents and volunteers. Then later, with the support of Fr. Tom Firestone, the pastor at the time, the first organized program drew 17 families. Catechists included a mix of parishioners and U-M students. Initially, the program featured family retreats, outdoor masses and picnics at West Park. Children’s Liturgy of the Word was held monthly with children as servers and lectors at Mass, followed by a potluck brunch, then multi-age “Family Time” events, including a speaker for adults.

By the second year, 34 families had registered, and the leaders recruited more U-M student catechists. They offered a monthly training and planning session for the college catechists, which remains a cornerstone of the SMSP religious ed. program today.

Eventually, as family enrollment grew and more catechists came onboard, the program was renamed

“First Sunday.” It included an oversight committee to help plan curriculum. Professional teachers led by Angela Robben helped partner with the students to train and encourage their teaching skills.

By 2003, the addition of Sr. Catherine and Sr. Dorothy to the staff helped formalize the sessions, which were now held twice on that monthly Sunday (after the 8:30 a.m. and noon masses. A third session was added for a time, then discontinued). Sessions were for K-8, plus classes to prepare students for the sacraments.

“Parents were very involved, and it was an energetic learning and meal sharing experience,” said organizer Andre Vasher.

“When our kids saw how vested their parents were in their religious education, they took the experience more seriously. Adults also benefitted from some excellent education sessions while our children attended their grade-appropriate classes.”

Highlights of these years include:

- Family potlucks and breakfasts were shared before the sessions.
- A strong service component was important, including Flint Service Trips, Alpha House, Feast Day of Service, Teen Confirmation service hours, but also opportunities for family socialization, such as camping and outdoor activities.
- Gretchen Baumgartner was added as director, then later Karen Thomas, who introduced the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd format for very young children.
- Dedicated classes for children in the Hispanic/Latino community were added.

“Family Faith Formation,” as it is now known, has continued to adapt to accommodate the larger number of families participating, as well as changes in technology and materials that are now available. Through it all, parent sessions and family support have remained the focus.

Karen Foster, the current coordinator, said more than 60 catechists ministered this year throughout the programs, serving 111 families, 140 children in K-7, plus a large Teen Confirmation class of 58 students. While classes were able to pivot quickly and be flexible with online learning during COVID, they are now all back to in-person gatherings.

None of this could have happened without those former and current parishioners and staff. The parish would like to thank the Donze, Adams, Lehman, Heyward, Sorenson, Hirsch, McDonough, Robben, Perrone, Vasher, and Leavey families. Also, the East, Foster, Bouchard, Thomas, Forgacs, Maxbauer, Rodriguiz, Kolevar, Baidel, Marsik, Feiler, Psarouthakis, Brown, Bouchard, Leach, Ryan, Torella, Kromis, and Baumgarten families. There are countless others, plus Frs. Wegher, Firestone, Reyna and former and present pastors.

It truly does take a village!

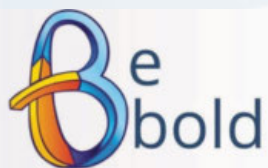

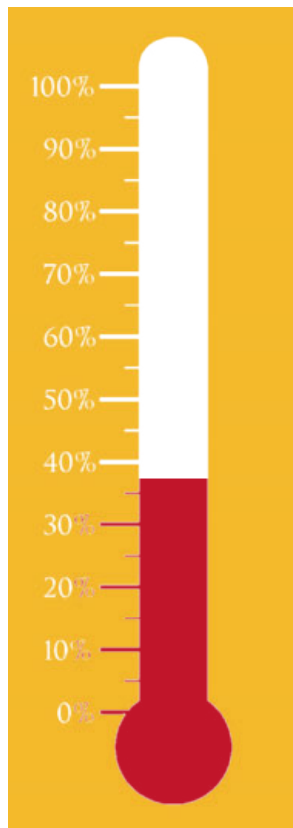

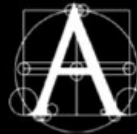
