WHY DO WE SING?

My third grade teacher Mrs. K. carried a spark of generosity obvious in the tender way she handled a mob of nine-year-olds. But she couldn't carry a tune in a bucket. And she knew it. Nonetheless, I remember her being the first to grab a hymnal at our Wednesday school Masses. Perhaps sensing unheard criticism, she would say things like "I know my voice doesn't

sound good, but Jesus loves to hear it." At that time my voice wasn't any better than hers (I didn't learn to sing until high school). But Mrs. K's example convinced me that it didn't matter to God, so even before I could sing well, I always sang too.

In addition to his famous healings, Solanus Casey also played the violin. Badly. One evening he wanted to entertain the other friars with some fiddle tunes during evening recreation. They responded by turning up the radio until he took the hint and left. That night he went, surely hurt, to the One who always loved his playing. From his novitiate to his last Christmas on earth, other friars frequently heard the familiar squeak of Solanus's violin when they stopped by the Blessed Sacrament late at night.

We live in an appearance-obsessed society, in a town with a hyper-competitive university, in a parish filled with talented people. Doing things we are not good at, publicly no less, is a threatening proposition. Secondly, in a parish blessed with musicians, isn't it someone else's job to sing? Wouldn't we rather hear the people who sing well? Don't we want to offer God the most beautiful worship we can, even if that means excluding some voices?

But as Mrs. K. and Solanus knew, singing is not for the singer, it is "for the one who loves." God desires that our joyful noise be a witness to His Glory, His Mercy, His Providence. Not to our ability.

This is not a choir recruitment advertisement. My greatest desire for music in this parish is not that we have larger choirs, more instrumentalists, or more congregational singing. All of these are good and serve the ultimate end. But that ultimate end of music is loving on God. The primary and guiding goal of this ministry is to aid prayer, to help all of us grow closer to God.

If you're not usually a singer, please consider picking up your hymnal and joining us in prayer this weekend. And if you decide not to pray through singing externally, please join us in interior prayer; taking a moment to reflect and revel in our privilege of gathering together to give worship and be in relationship with our all-loving Creator.


