REFLECTION ON MARRIAGE

CCC p 1641...*Christian spouses have their own special gifts in the People of God. This grace proper to the sacrament of Matrimony is intended to perfect the couple's love and to strengthen their indissoluble unity. By this grace they help one another to attain holiness in their married life..*

Each year, the staff of St. Mary Student Parish prepares 40 couples for the sacrament of marriage. This includes an annual 2-day event where our engaged couples are blessed by many of our parish couples, staff, and others as they are presented with both practical and spiritual aspects of marriage.

So much of our current culture contradicts the beauty, mystery, and gift of the call of indissoluble unity, and the art of self-giving. I admire these couples who choose to do the work necessary (much more than forms and checked boxes) by attending the seminar.

God is faithful in His care and love for all of us. He designed marriage to be a conduit of grace for all couples, no matter where they might be on their faith journey.

One way in which my husband Tom and I seek grace is at each Sunday mass we have a little ritual. During the offertory as the altar is prepared, either Tom or I will take our wedding ring off and hand it to the other. For a few moments we will both pray and thank God for his presence in marriage and pray for each other. We may mention a current struggle or need, and ask for direction.

The beauty of our Catholic mass makes it possible for this little prayer to be mystically joined to the gifts of the people, as they are then carried to the altar to be transformed with the bread and wine. *Use caution, one Sunday the ring slipped and rolled a few aisles away at a crowded mass, which was both humorous and distracting!*

One thing that was a turning point of grace in our marriage was when Tom and I began praying together. For a few short minutes in the morning, we found a quiet space and talked to each other and to God. Honestly, it was very awkward in the beginning because we weren't in the same place spiritually and didn't realize how intimate our feelings for God were. But as we persevered God showed us small consolations for us to reach out, and our time together became a daily habit. Catholic

Book Publishing Corp. has an excellent book of minute meditations for every day titled "Daily Companion for Married Couples", available on Amazon. This little treasure would be a great beginning for any couple looking for a resource to help them pray together.

To any couple unhappy, lonely, or lost in the struggles of life there is hope. The church offers an excellent program for those who may be considering separation or divorce called Retrouvaille, A Lifeline for Married Couples. 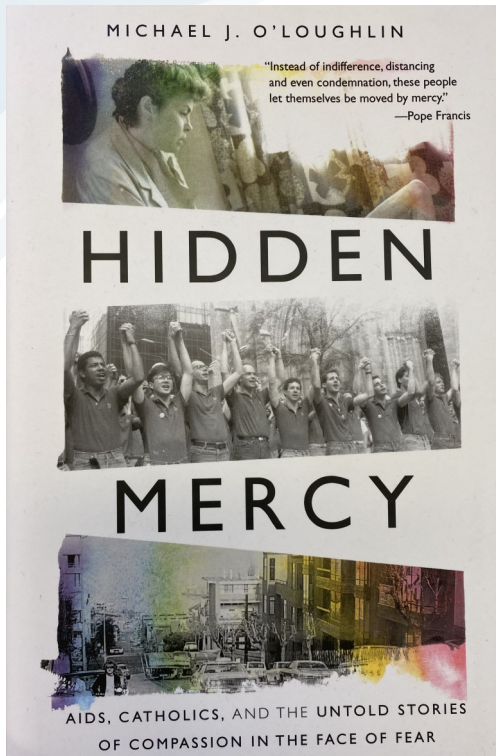

TRAVEL TO LANSING ON

FEBRUARY 28TH

Strangers No Longer (Catholics in parishes/high schools who support and advocate for the needs of immigrants) invites us to a special event. On February 28, we will be heading to Lansing to meet with our State Representatives and State Senators to encourage them to vote for the passage of the "Drive Safe" bills that are going to be introduced in the State House and Senate. These bills will allow immigrants to get Drivers' Licenses and State ID's regardless of immigrant status (as they were able to do until 2008 – and as 18 other states allow).

The committee has taken into consideration several options before narrowing the choices to two chairs, including coordination with the church's interior finishes, comfort, durability, cleanability, sound/acoustics, flexibility for stacking and seating arrangements, size, weight, and cost.

The chairs will be displayed in the atrium during the weekends of February 25-26 and March 4-5. They will be identified as Chair A and B and will have their specifications listed, along with a brief survey.
