LORD, STRETCH MY HEART

If we're doing Lent right, we're hoping for a time that's rich in prayer, reading, sacrificing, and being more attentive to those in need. That's not always easy, but we have a good example of how to do things right – we just need to look at Jesus.

If you're in one of our Small Church Communities this season, you'll know that ties in with our main theme for this Lent: "We are made to love as Christ loves."

When we come to know who Jesus is, to absorb what he said and did, we want to live more like him – to have "the same mind" as Christ, as St. Paul tells us. The Sunday readings during Lent show us great examples of how Jesus handled things while he walked the earth in human form. We see Jesus rejecting big temptations, praying and conversing with God, changing the life of an outcast woman he meets at the town well, healing and loving people, giving new life to his friend, Lazarus, and finally, "emptying himself" completely on the cross.

Jesus is always showing us how to live and love, then he sends the Holy Spirit to help us do the same.

This idea of mirroring the mind of Christ – choosing as Christ chose – also overlaps with our parish's Big Read for Lent. The Anti-Racism Working Group and the LGBT Outreach Ministry have chosen the book, *Hidden Mercy -- AIDS, Catholics, and the Untold Stories of Compassion in the Face of Fear.* The author profiles Catholic heroes who cared for AIDS patients back in the 1980s and '90s – a time when society (and some church leaders) tended to shun and shame the gay community, even as it was being decimated by AIDS.

We can imagine that these Catholic caregivers served the sick because they wanted to do what Jesus showed us. They chose to love as Christ loves – not condemning, but healing and hanging out with people on the margins. So our prayers for Lent might be centered on some thoughts like these:

"How can I choose as Jesus chose in responding to the challenges found in today's society?"

"What do I actually see Jesus doing, and hear him saying in the Gospel readings?"

"What can help me to choose compassion over fear, as these Catholics did in the AIDS crisis?"

Prayer: "Stretch My Heart"

Thank you, Jesus, for showing me there is always room to be more inclusive. When I am feeling overwhelmed, meet me in prayer. Stretch my heart. Expand my ability to love, especially those who are outside my normal circle. Deepen my desire to share the love you have so generously shared with me with others. Amen.



Into the Light is a fellowship group, a warm welcoming community, that has been meeting on Saturday mornings during Advent and Lent since the 1970's.



We will meet this Lent at 9:00AM on the following Saturdays: March 11, March 18, March 25, and April 1.


You need not attend every meeting to participate and enjoy this prayer time.







LATINO COLLEGE STUDENT GROUP FOR UNDERGRADS & GRADUATE STUDENTS
