

Parish Insight

ALTERNATIVE SPRING BREAK REFLECTION BY JULIA NOVOTNY, CAMPUS MINISTER

Each year, St. Mary Student Parish sends students on a weeklong immersion over Spring Break through the Alternative Spring Break Program (ASB). This program offers students the opportunity to immerse themselves among those living on the margins of society and gain an understanding of the root causes of key justice issues that impact these communities. Different from traditional mission trips which emphasize service to communities, our students are formed to enter these experiences ready to listen and learn with each encounter and to discover Christ in the other.

This year, our students traveled to the Br. David Darst Center in Chicago to explore five key justice issues: homelessness, food insecurity, education, incarceration, and immigration. Each day, our students traveled to two partner sites on Chicago's south side and reflected on these experiences in the evening, connecting them back to their faith. Carson Ching, one of this year's Site Leaders, reflected on his experience: "While we did perform services such as assisting clients at food pantries and reading with students, our bigger purpose was to simply be with those in marginalized communities." This emphasis on listening and learning enables our students to see those they encounter as Christ sees them, and inspires in our students a desire to live a faith that does justice.

Thank you for all your prayers, generosity and support of this important ministry. I am grateful to St. Mary for its commitment to a faith that does justice and feel privileged to journey alongside such amazing students!

To close, I offer the prayer which we pray at the end of each ASB formation session:

ASB Prayer At the end of life,

We will not be judged by How many diplomas we have received, How much money we have made, How many great things we have done.

We will be judged by "I was hungry and you gave me to eat, I was naked and you clothed me, I was homeless and you took me in."

But hungry not only for bread, But hungry for love; Naked not only for clothing, but naked of human dignity and respect; Homeless not only for want of a room and bricks, But homeless because of rejection.

Loving Jesus, Help us to see you in the people we meet. Help us to reach out beyond ourselves and enter into the world of others. Open our hearts to be moved with compassion And desire to serve you by serving others.
