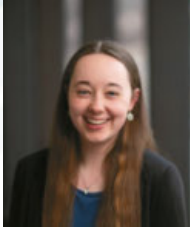

Parish Insight

“Christ is Present Here “

I hadn't fully experienced what the Body of Christ, present in His Church, meant until I came to St. Mary Student Parish. While the Catholic community I had grown up with back home in Grand Rapids definitely played an important role in my life, I didn't feel like I truly belonged to a community until I found myself a timid freshman, walking through the doors for Sunday mass my first weekend in college. I remember being invited from the pulpit to attend Ig.nite, Fresh Gathering, and a wide variety of other welcome week events. My heart was aching for community, and St Mary seemed like a good place to seek it.

Flash-forward four years... a lot has changed, globally (college during a pandemic had its challenges) but more importantly, a lot has changed for me spiritually. The many encounters I experienced in my first semester of college – encounters of true friendship, community, and Christ's Eucharistic Presence – fed a hunger that I'd always had. I felt so alive, and I just wanted to dive deeper into my faith. These last four years haven't been perfect – school and life stresses have stolen my joy from time to time – but throughout every stumble, Jesus has continued to invite me closer to His Precious Heart. When the opportunity arose to spend another year, post-graduation, here at St Mary, I felt Jesus inviting me to serve this community that had spent the past four years serving me.

I began my role in campus ministry as a Campus Missionary Disciple (CMD) in August, and the energy this year has been absolutely electric. I cried a little at the first 8pm student mass; the church was so full, *the Body of Christ so alive on campus. COVID stripped much of my college experience of its full potential. But this year has been a gift to me. It's been an honor to get to know new students, whose vibrant energy filled the whole church at our recent New Student Retreat. And it's been a joy to see lines for confession on the Diag and lines each Sunday after mass for Sunday Snack as students chat and laugh.*

When I think of the Body of Christ, I see pews filled with students, hungry to be filled. I think of Eucharistic Adoration, where God has made Himself known to me. Many faces come to mind; I can't help but muse on meeting new people in the lounge, speaking Spanish at lunchtime with coworkers, and all my dear friends I've been given to love here at St Mary.

There are ways everyone can join in the effort to build the Body of Christ among our undergraduate students. First and foremost, please pray for our campus ministry this year, especially as we prepare for Fall retreat in early November. Pray for students to have life-changing encounters with this beautiful Body of Christ we're so blessed to have here. And if you're able, I invite you in a special way to support our student parishioners financially, especially these next two weeks as we begin our Fall retreat fundraiser. Fall retreat is one of the most impactful experiences we offer to students, but it is a big undertaking. Your donations can help make it possible for all interested students to attend. Our work wouldn't be possible without your generosity.

Lastly, I invite you to join us Monday-Thursday, when we have Eucharistic Adoration available for at least an hour daily. Building the Body of Christ starts with each of us growing in our individual relationships with God. Jesus is waiting for you – whether student, staff, or resident parishioner – to encounter Him in a deeper way in Adoration. We praise our God who is present in the bread and wine and whenever the Church gathers to sing or pray (Sacrosanctum Concilium 7). God bless you.

Respect Life Month

With the news of Hamas bombing Israel, who in turn has declared war, it is worth asking how we as Catholics are to think/pray/reflect about complicated international situations such as this one. Given that we are celebrating Respect Life Month, what follows are selected paragraphs from the Catechism of the Catholic Church that pertain to issues of war. May we keep the people of Israel and Palestine, particularly innocent civilians and those who have been marginalized, firmly in our prayers these days.

Peace

By recalling the commandment, "You shall not kill," our Lord asked for peace of heart and denounced murderous anger and hatred as immoral.

Anger is a desire for revenge. "To desire vengeance in order to do evil to someone who should be punished is illicit," but it is praiseworthy to impose restitution "to correct vices and maintain justice."

If anger reaches the point of a deliberate desire to kill or seriously wound a neighbor, it is gravely against charity; it is a mortal sin. The Lord says, "Everyone who is angry with his brother shall be liable to judgment."

Deliberate *hatred* is contrary to charity. Hatred of the neighbor is a sin when one deliberately wishes him evil. Hatred of the neighbor is a grave sin when one deliberately desires him grave harm. "But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven."

Respect for and development of human life require peace. Peace is not merely the absence of war, and it is not limited to maintaining a balance of powers between adversaries. Peace cannot be attained on earth without safeguarding the goods of persons, free communication among men, respect for the dignity of persons and peoples, and the assiduous practice of fraternity. Peace is "the tranquillity of order." Peace is the work of justice and the effect of charity.

Avoiding war

The fifth commandment forbids the intentional destruction of human life. Because of the evils and injustices that accompany all war, the Church insistently urges everyone to prayer and to action so that the divine Goodness may free us from the ancient bondage of war.

All citizens and all governments are obliged to work for the avoidance of war.

However, "as long as the danger of war persists and there is no international authority with the necessary competence and power, governments cannot be denied the right of lawful self-defense, once all peace efforts have failed."

Non-combatants, wounded soldiers, and prisoners must be respected and treated humanely. Actions deliberately contrary to the law of nations and to its universal principles are crimes, as are the orders that command such actions. Blind obedience does not suffice to excuse those who carry them out. Thus the extermination of a people, nation, or ethnic minority must be condemned as a mortal sin. One is morally bound to resist orders that command genocide.

Injustice, excessive economic or social inequalities, envy, distrust, and pride raging among men and nations constantly threaten peace and cause wars. Everything done to overcome these disorders contributes to building up peace and avoiding war: Insofar as men are sinners, the threat of war hangs over them and will so continue until Christ comes again; but insofar as they can vanquish sin by coming together in charity, violence itself will be vanquished and these words will be fulfilled: "they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more."

Dr. John Bergsma serves as Professor of Theology at the Franciscan University of Steubenville and Vice President at the St. Paul Center. He holds the M.Div. and Th.M. degrees from Calvin Seminary, Grand Rapids, Michigan, and served as a Protestant pastor for four years before entering the Catholic Church in 2001 while pursuing a Ph.D. in Theology from the University of Notre Dame. He specialized in the Old Testament and the Dead Sea Scrolls, graduating with high honors in 2004.

He is the bestselling author of numerous books on Scripture including his most recent release: *The Word of the Lord: Reflections on the Sunday Mass Readings for Year A*. Other popular books include *Jews and the Dead Sea Scrolls: Revealing the Jewish Roots of the Church*, *Introduction to the Bible: The Old Testament*, the *Bible Basics* series, and *Stunned by Scripture*.
