## Parish Insight

### "Embracing Mexico's Day of the Dead"

I lived in Mexico for several years, and during that time, I was fortunate to experience the unique and beautiful tradition of the Day of the Dead, or "Día de los Muertos." This tradition never ceased to amaze me, offering a huge contrast to the way we honor our loved ones in my native France.

Initially I didn't understand the concept of an "ofrenda" when the daycare asked us to bring one for the altar in memory of a great Mexican singer (see first picture). I remember asking some Mexican friends what I was supposed to bring and more information about this tradition. While I never personally set up my own altar, as it's not a part of my cultural heritage, I always loved to see the beautiful altars and ofrendas lovingly created by others. Altars are meticulously decorated with marigold flowers, candles, sugar skulls, objects that remind the deceased and photographs.

During many years, I used to bring my kids to a small cemetery close to my house, it was an amazing experience: The tombs were lovingly adorned with beautiful flowers, making the cemeteries a truly enchanting atmosphere (see picture) . The cemeteries came alive with people singing, dancing, and sharing stories. Some people were even bringing food to share with their loved ones. I realized that each one told a unique and touching story. In France, our observance of All Saints' Day is far more solemn and lacks the joy of the Mexican celebration.

In downtown Puebla too, you felt the day of dead atmosphere: the streets were adorned with marigolds, sugar skulls, and colorful papel picado banners. The air was filled with the aroma of traditional Mexican food, tamales, tacos and churros. We used to eat "Pan de Muertos", a delightful and typical treat of the celebration.

The vibrant, joyous atmosphere of this Mexican celebration had not only left a lasting impression but also confirmed my place within the heart of Mexico, a place I called home for many years.


### **ANNOUNCES CLOSING RALLY & JERICHO MARCH – Sunday, November 5<sup>th</sup> - 2 PM!**



Dr. John Bergsma serves as Professor of Theology at the Franciscan University of Steubenville and Vice President at the St. Paul Center. He holds the M.Div. and Th.M. degrees from Calvin Seminary, Grand Rapids, Michigan, and served as a Protestant pastor for four years before entering the Catholic Church in 2001 while pursuing a Ph.D. in Theology from the University of Notre Dame. He specialized in the Old Testament and the Dead Sea Scrolls, graduating with high honors in 2004.

He is the bestselling author of numerous books on Scripture including his most recent release: *The Word of the Lord: Reflections on the Sunday Mass Readings for Year A*. Other popular books include *Jesus and the Dead Sea Scrolls: Revealing the Jewish Roots of the Church*, *Introduction to the Bible: The Old Testament*, the *Bible Basics* series, and *Stunned by Scripture*.
