"WALKING WITH OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE"

As a kid, my mom and my grandmother instilled our faith in us. Ever since I can remember, every year we couldn't go to the Church or the Basilica in town but they would watch the Mañanitas (prayers and songs to celebrate our Lady of Guadalupe) on TV. It was at 12am and we would be watching all that was on TV.

Once they started celebrating it in our town, we would get up at 5am to go to Church. This was like a party. Mom would tell us to go to bed early so we could get up early but we would stay up all night watching the program on TV. It was like we already had an alarm in our heads, that even before the church bells rang, we were already waiting because we were going to the church!

And I have a testimony that I remember and it gives me goosebumps. One year, my dad was out of work and my mom only had tortillas to feed us. We didn't have any money. We, children went to school so we couldn't work. But I remember one Dec 12, I stayed home with mom and we were going to go to church. I was the first one awake, we got ready and left. But my mom was still home preparing food for when we came back from church. So when I left the house, I stopped on the path and waited for her. I was in the dark because at that time there still wasn't any public lighting. And I, even today, don't understand it. I was on the path, and I remember feeling something with my foot. It was as if someone was telling me to lift your foot. I lifted what was under my foot, and put it in my pocket, but it was still dark so I couldn't tell what it was. And when I got to the church, I remember I bent down to make the sign of the cross but it came to my mind...what did I pick up? And that's when I looked at what was in my pocket...and it was 100 pesos. And I remember thinking...how did that happen? How did I feel that with my feet? It was the time of the harvest and everyone was passing along these paths with their crops and a lot of leaves fell along the path. And that year we simply didn't have anything to live off of. And on the way home I gave the 100 pesos to my mom and told her what happened. And she said "this is so that we can eat".

Even today I don't understand how I felt the urge to pick up that bill. It was as if someone told me to pick it up. Like a sensation to not leave it there, 100 pesos – at that time, it

was a lot of money. I was eight years old. My mom asked me where I found it and I said on the path, and she insisted "how did you find this on the path if everything is dark? You can't see anything. I said that I felt the urge that I had to pick it up. There isn't any other explanation than that God was giving us a gift so we could eat.

Before coming here, one year before, I made a pilgrimage to the Basilica of the Virgin. It's 8 days of walking, and my dad was worried that I wouldn't make it. But a woman who was also going to make the pilgrimage said not to worry because if I couldn't do it there were trucks that would help us advance. But from my town, I was the only woman going. There were women going from other towns but they told me that we had to go by communities. But I didn't even bring the flag of our town. I figured if I had to go back, I would. But one of the women said, but how are you going to go back if you are all alone? But still the other women didn't want me to go with them. And after, only about 5 minutes later, the women had to get a ride from one of the trucks. They couldn't take it anymore.


The pilgrimage is like a penitence, but also a way to thank God for the good we have received. God never gives us bad things in our lives. But these women got in the truck instead. They looked like they were ok. They didn't look exhausted. They just lacked faith. The one woman kept asking me if I wanted help, if I wanted to ride the truck, but I said no, that I wanted to keep walking. I felt sad for the women because they had the desire to walk, but no. One shouldn't put up obstacles to God...

The Virgin of Guadalupe represents us as Mexicans. She is like our symbol or flag. In all of Latin America, not just in Mexico. She is the living image of the love of God for us. She is the love of a mother for us and through her we will reach Jesus' love. She is my guide, my model to follow. Sometimes it hurts to remember...but I know God is always with me.

Please join us in celebrating the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe on Tuesday, December 12 at 7 pm and pray the Rosary with us from December 4 to 12 at 6:30 am and sing The Mañanitas to Our Lady of Guadalupe.



CATHOLIC SCHOOL TUITION ASSISTANCE GRANTS AVAILABLE

Many families need and receive financial assistance for Catholic school tuition through the need-based Diocese of Lansing scholarship program. Diocese of Lansing grants are available for all students from grades K-8 (\$750 per student) and grades 9-12 (\$1,000 per student). In addition, the Venerable Augustus Tolton Scholarship (\$500) is aimed at increasing the number of Black Catholic students in the Diocese's Catholic schools, while the St. Sánchez del Rio Scholarship (\$500) is aimed at helping a greater number of Hispanic Catholic families in the Diocese afford a Catholic education for their children.


