VOLUNTEERING AT THE WARMING CENTER CHANGED MY LIFE

I will not give money to beggars on the street. I'm usually intimidated by their presence. I fear that cash given directly to them might go to feed addictions, and I'm not helping in a meaningful way. This may not always be true, but I prefer to give fruit or nuts to people asking for money. Additionally, I give cash donations to reputable institutions that show their finances with transparency and responsibly help the poor with what they truly need: a job (if they can keep one), clothes, shelter, nutrition, mental health services, warmth, love, and respect.

The Warming Center at St. Mary's gave me a new opportunity. In a safe space for the unhoused individuals and me, I can look them in the eye, serve meals to them, and exchange smiles like equal human beings. Each person has a story of how they became homeless, but it's not my business to judge. I'm there to support them in that moment, providing nourishment with love and respect. I'm not afraid of them anymore. They have become whole perfect beings to me. When you let love guide you instead of your critical thinking, you see the beautiful, unique beings they are.

I've been collecting warm clothing and shoes for them because I noticed some were getting wet in the rain. An intense cold was coming, and they were unprepared. We sometimes have such an excess of everything in our homes, and we have no clue about the basic needs of others right in our backyard. Being originally from Peru, I never imagined that in the United States of America, the most powerful country on Earth, there was no adequate safety net for a mentally ill person, someone suffering from severe addictions or just going through a rough patch in their life. I thought those were third-world problems.

I realize that homelessness has many causes and is a complex issue, but I invite everyone to volunteer to help our fellow human beings who need our support. They won't take more than they need because they must haul it with them. They need to travel light. Have you ever thought about that? I learned it from James, who was trying clothes on in the donations room. I tried convincing him to take more things, but he refused and explained. What an eye-opener that was!

It's a good spiritual practice to get in the shoes of an unhoused person and think in detail what a day of that person's life is like. We can learn a lot from them by volunteering at the Warming Center. I promise they will help you keep things in perspective in your own life.

Homelessness can seem overwhelming, but you can make a difference for a few individuals on a given day, which might mean the world to someone! I guarantee you will never be the same; you will hold our shared humanity in your heart forever.

Thanks to the generosity of our parishioners, the Warming Center has been able to serve 80 to 100 people experiencing homelessness each day throughout the month of January.






WOMEN OF THE HEART


THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 8 10:15 AM


