Parish Insight

THE MOST IMPORTANT MEAL OF THE WEEK

On April 27, 2024, thirty-five children received their first Holy Communion. It was such a lovely celebration for the children, families, friends and for me as well. Seeing how happy and excited the children were to receive their First Holy Communion reminded me of what a special gift receiving Jesus in the Eucharist is and how, amid our hectic and busy lives, we (myself included) can sometimes take this holy gift for granted.

We are all seeking fulfillment in our lives and the Sacrament of the Eucharist is the “food” that promises to satisfy our deepest cravings. St. Ignatius of Loyola taught that ultimately, all our desires can be traced to our desire for God. (Paprocki 50)

Fr. Dan’s wonderful and inspiring First Communion Mass homily enkindled the importance of the Eucharist so I thought I would share some of it with you.

Fr. Dan began by asking the children, “What meal do many say is the most important meal of the day?” To no surprise, most answered, “breakfast”, although one child did say that “dinner” was the most important meal to him. Fr. Dan also asked the children who had prepared this most important meal for them and why they thought these people did this. Most said a parent or friend made their breakfast and the unanimous answer to “why” they prepared them breakfast was “because they love us!” Fr. Dan then suggested that perhaps the real reason “breakfast” is considered the most important meal of the day was not only for the nourishment but because the day is started off with the gift of love. He let the children in on a secret: “Breakfast may be the most important meal of the day but that **the Eucharist is the most important meal of the week!**” He then gave three reasons why he believes this:

God gives us what we need from God. When the Israelites were starving in the desert, they asked God for food and God rained down bread from Heaven. God did this because the Israelites asked him to. God answers our prayers and when we receive the Eucharist, we can ask God to please give us what we need this week; perhaps strength, love, or food. We can ask God to please give us your body. Through the Eucharist, we receive what we need from God.

We do what God asked us to do. At the last supper, Jesus took bread, he broke it, and he gave it to the disciples and said, “Do

this in memory of me.” This is why we have Mass because Jesus said this is how he wants us to remember him. We celebrate because he is with us and we do it out of love because he loved us first.

We become what we receive. We are what we eat – in other words, what we put in our body can change us. For example, if we eat pizza every day for every meal then we will become unhealthy. What we consume, what we watch, who are friends, etc. forms us as human beings. When we receive the Body of Christ, we believe that it can change us little by little. It can change us to be more loving and patient. Receiving the Eucharist gives us the chance to become more and more like Jesus which is what we want and what we are striving for.

Fr. Dan asked us to remember and love God more and more deeply each time we receive the Eucharist with the hope that little by little our hearts will be changed to be more like our loving God whose Body and Blood we are so privileged to receive. (Dixon)

I recently asked the parents of the First Communicants why they wanted their child(ren) to receive their First Holy Communion. Please see their inspiring and encouraging responses below:

“I wanted my son to receive 1st Holy Communion to continue the tradition in our family of growing with Jesus Christ.”

“We wanted our children to receive their First Communion so that we could all participate in Communion together as a family.”

“We wanted our son to receive his First Communion so he could deepen his relationship with Jesus and experience in this new way Jesus as his friend.”

My hope is for all of us to cherish and hold dear the Holy Eucharist and as one parent so beautifully stated, “to more fully enter into communion with his church family and receive the greatest gift given to humankind!”

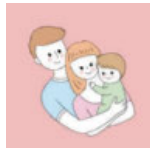

SUNDAY PARKING— OPERATIONAL CHANGE

Beginning June 2024, City public parking facilities will make an operational change to lower structure and lot gate arms on Sundays. Parking will still be free on Sundays, but the gates will be down, and parking patrons will need to pull a ticket to enter the facility. When exiting, parking patrons will simply insert their parking ticket into the in-lane exit equipment and the gate will go up.

Parkers who lose their ticket can use the same procedure as during the week, push the call button on the in-lane equipment and speak with PCI staff for assistance. Lost ticket charges will be waived for the first 4 months. However, beginning in October 2024 lost tickets will be charged for 24 hours of parking, as is standard during the week.

This change is being made to align the system with best practices in parking. An operation where gates stay down provides internal and revenue controls, as well as operational efficiencies related to space counts and permit parkers. This will also help to track of Sunday utilization.
