Planning Study Results

Dear St. Mary Student Parish community,

Over the last few months, we have been in active discernment as to whether the time is right to hold a capital campaign to address significant needs in our community. We have been offered the opportunity to conduct a combined capital campaign to garner support for these parish-specific needs as we join the Diocese of Lansing for a recently launched initiative to support Catholic education throughout the diocese. The Stewardship for Saints and Scholars campaign underscores a deep commitment to schools, families and parishes, aiming to enhance the accessibility and affordability of Catholic education while reinforcing its mission.

I would like to personally thank you for sharing your reflections and feedback in the recent planning study conducted to determine whether we should proceed with a combined campaign. Your voice has been critical in helping us in our discernment. Results from the survey were encouraging, with a participation rate of 37%—significantly higher than the 25% average our fundraising consultant, the Steier Group, typically sees. Over 77% of respondents indicated their intention to support the campaign financially. Moreover, 106 respondents expressed interest in serving in a leadership role for the campaign.

The high participation rate, including input from more than 450 parish households, and the great willingness to contribute to a combined campaign, reflect the deep and sustained commitment to and love for St. Mary Student Parish. In light of these strong results, the Steier Group has recommended that we move forward with a combined campaign. After careful prayer and discernment, and with the unanimous support from our parish Finance Council and the blessing of the Diocese, we are excited to announce the launch of this campaign! Our local fundraising endeavors will enrich the spiritual mission of St. Mary by ensuring continued support for our ongoing ministries to students and residents, while addressing various projects within the church and Newman Center. We aim to bolster funds to expand both resident parishioner and campus ministry initiatives. Furthermore, funds raised will help us resolve critical maintenance issues, provide aesthetic and practical enhancements to the church, complete facility upgrades, promote sustainability, and improve our courtyard.

Throughout the summer, parish leaders will finalize our campaign goals, recruit a dedicated leadership team, and develop communication materials. We are committed to keeping the parish informed at every stage of the campaign's progress. Please stay tuned for updates in the coming weeks and months. We kindly ask for your prayers for our parish, the success of the campaign, and all those involved in this important endeavor. May we trust that God will enable our community to thrive for the next 100 years!




