
Join Us for Commitment Weekend – January 11-12

Are you interested in singing or playing on instrument for the Holy Thursday, Good Friday, or Easter Vigil services?


All students and resident parishioners are invited to join this large ensemble supporting music across the three days

Faith Doing Justice



St. Mary Student Parish is hosting the DAYTIME WARMING CENTER for those experiencing homelessness JANUARY 6 – 31, 2025.

We are seeking the following items: hand and foot warmers, bus tokens, \$5 coffee gift cards, emergency thermal survival blankets, ear plugs, hygiene kit items (individual lotion, chapstick, hand sanitizer, deodorant, razors, shaving cream, toothbrush, toothpaste, floss, body wipes, dry shampoo, travel size shampoo and bodywash, nail clippers, neosporin, bandages, individual tissue packs).

Food items: snacks high in protein like protein bars, hard boiled eggs, cheese and sausage sticks, individual yogurts and cottage cheese, fresh cut vegetables like peppers, cucumbers, and cherry tomatoes (please avoid very hard vegetables for dental reasons), jell-o and pudding cups, individual drink packs like Kool-aid, Crystal Lite and other flavor packs, bottled water, juices, individually packaged snacks to take on the go.




