Parish Insight

ST MARY STUDENT PARISH STRATEGIC PLAN: "INVITE. ENGAGE. DEEPEN."

The first time I celebrated a weekend Mass at St. Mary, I remember the lector saying, "Greet your neighbor by name," and taking a deep breath. This never works in Catholic churches, I thought.


Then, to my surprise, the Church became abuzz with energy. Students and residents of all ages connecting as one body of Christ.

In February 2023, St. Mary conducted a survey of parishioners about their experience belonging here. 135 of you responded. We felt the presence of the Holy Spirit in your responses in two ways. First, you really like it here, especially the liturgies and community. 88% of respondents would "strongly recommend" St. Mary to a friend, and 96% agree or strongly agreed that "I feel welcomed and accepted in my Church."

Second, we sensed the Spirit calling us as a community: it's time to go deeper. 96% agreed or strongly agreed that St. Mary "provides opportunities to serve," but over half reported participating in a service activity quarterly or less. A majority of respondents reported sharing their faith (60%) or inviting someone to Mass or another parish activity (70%) less than twice a year.

Over the past two years, St. Mary Student Parish continues to grow. Mass attendance and small group participation is increasing across all our communities, especially among our students. But the Spirit has left us with a lingering question: how can we create a culture where parishioners are empowered to share their God-given gifts?

The seeds of our strategic plan were sown. In 2024, three committees were formed to help us address opportunities to grow in the areas of Evangelization, Encounter, and Stewardship. Made up of a healthy mix of the intercultural and intergenerational diversity that makes our parish unique, these committees have bonded over the common goal of strengthening the mission of St. Mary Student Parish. We quickly realized these are not isolated disciplines but part of an integrated, relational, and healthy parish. We hope the following framework helps explain this dynamic further:



Invite. To attend Mass or an event at St. Mary, most must be invited. Personal relationships are paramount in helping folks feel welcome and see themselves belonging here.

Engage. Upon attending Mass or an event at St. Mary, we hope that both visitors and parishioners are engaged intellectually and spiritually. They should be fed by community and conversation, faith and (sometimes) food.

Deepen. Engaged by their St. Mary's experience, we hope that many visitors and parishioners will find themselves desiring to grow in their faith and to share their gifts with others, both inside and outside of the walls of St. Mary. With support from the community, we believe the Holy Spirit will encourage them to share their faith with their families, neighbors, co-workers, classmates and friends, whom they will feel called to **Invite** to join them on their faith journey.

To realize this vision, we need to be practical. This year, our focus will be on implementation. Nine strategic priorities have been outlined, thanks to the good work of our three committees. We have already begun implementing some. planting seeds for this strategic vision to blossom. For example, you have probably sensed our desire to "Engage the parish community through hospitality, fellowship" through the return of coffee and donuts!

Other priorities will require further conversation and planning. For example, we hope to rehab our website and social media presence in a way that will attract new student and resident parishioners while increasing engagement with those who already attend. With the support of implementation teams, we aim to realize our vision by 2030.

We are excited about our emerging strategic plan and look forward to your feedback and questions. It has been an honor to be invited to help articulate this vision and strategic plan for the St. Mary community. Please reach out to any of us with questions you may have, or if you would like to be a part of making this vision a reality. Come, Holy Spirit!






