THE COUNTER-CULTURAL BEATITUDES

As Jesus stands before the great crowd in today's Gospel from Luke, he shows us what he values

most – the poor, the hungry, the outcasts. That doesn't fit with what our world tells us to value. Most likely his listeners didn't expect that either.

Scripture scholars say this "Beatitude" format would have been familiar to them. Look at our first reading (Jeremiah 17) which says, "Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord..." Psalm 41 says, "Blessed are those who consider the poor. The Lord will deliver them in time of trouble."

But here, Jesus turns things upside down, as he so often does. He's telling people not how they'll be rewarded for a good action. Rather, he points out that blessings will come to those who suffer, those who weep and mourn. Why would he want to encourage us to be in terrible situations – and to be happy about it?

Fr. John Foley, a Jesuit priest and composer at St. Louis University, writes that "a person has to be open and empty in order to let God and others come in. In order to love and be loved we need to have space at the center of who we are."

For someone who is rich, he adds, "possessions become an 'instead of.' Instead of love I choose something more stable (so it looks): cars or households or corporations or just plain power. Instead of eating as much as we need, each North American who goes to a restaurant orders enough for five people!"

Jesus seems to be saying instead, "blessed are you if you try to stay empty, if you become a spacious home for God, for other human beings, for the long-suffering earth. There is only one reality, only one Being who can give us the bread of life, who can satisfy our deep capacity for love."

Getting ready for Lent

This theme of emptying ourselves to make space for God is something we strive for every year during Lent. As we approach Ash Wednesday (March 5th this year), we can look for ways to get closer to what Jesus is asking of us.

In solidarity with our brothers and sisters who have so little, can we try to curb our own consumption and give more to help someone else? In an effort to grow closer to Jesus, can we let go of the time we spend with unimportant things (I'll let you

decide what those might be) in order to spend more time with scripture and prayer – actually getting to know who Jesus is?

Here's another good plan for Lent: Consider joining one of our Small Church Communities. We'll have groups meeting at a variety of times once a week to look at the readings for the upcoming Sunday. Groups begin meeting the week of February 24th and run through Palm Sunday.

Faith sharing in small groups helps people to learn and grow together as they hear stories of how God is at work in other people's lives. It's one of the best ways to see how much we need the Light of Christ in our lives and in a world that seems to be so dark these days. One other great opportunity: Attend our upcoming Ignatian Prayer Series. Parishioners Etta Mac Donagh-Dumler and Jim Manney will help participants learn more about what lies behind the prayer practices of St. Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Jesuits. (See below).

A three-session series about Ignatian prayer practices and the thinking behind them. Explore what St. Ignatius thought about prayer and the methods of prayer he and others have developed to deepen our awareness of seeking and finding God in all things.






HELP THE HOMELESS!
