#### ASB REFLECTION

My name is Clara Rowe, and I am a senior here at the University of Michigan. This past spring break, I had the privilege of attending an alternative spring break trip through St. Mary's Student Parish. This was my third ASB trip. I traveled with five other students and Father Dan to Los Angeles, CA.

This trip exposed me to a community full of love for one another in Boyle Heights. I witnessed beautiful hope and trust in faith from each person I met, even in the face of stories involving immigration, gangs, and homelessness. At one point, we were serving food to the Guadalupe Housing Project (GHP) group. I sat down to eat and chat with a few of the men in the group. My wonderful friend Therese translated for me, and even with the language barrier, we shared beautiful moments of laughter, despite them just sharing the struggles of finding work.

The women at Dolores Mission also showed incredible hospitality. They opened up their homes, made delicious food, and shared stories of how, even when times were tough, they continued to come together to reflect on their experiences through scripture and trust in the Lord. We also had the opportunity to help out at the school. I assisted in a first -grade class and saw firsthand the teacher's patience and passion for helping these kids succeed in their community. Her love for each of them was evident in everything she did. We even got to meet Father Greg Boyle and experience how deeply he connects with each person in the community, valuing relationships with everyone he meets.

The last day we had the chance to see snippets of the rest of LA. I even got to check off touching the Pacific Ocean from my bucket list! If you are a student, I would highly recommend considering an ASB trip for spring break next year! It's a transformative experience that will leave you with lasting memories, a deeper understanding of other communities, and many new friends! I would also like to give a huge thank you to all the parishioners who help to contribute to these experiences so that students like me can continue to grow.





#### **OPENING THE CORNERSTONE'S COPPER BOX**

A cornerstone is a ceremonial building block, usually inscribed and placed ritually in the outer wall of a building to commemorate its dedication. Since the 19 th century it has been customary to hallow out the stone to hold a metal receptacle for articles reflecting current customs. With "impressive and interesting" ceremony, Bishop Michael J. Gallagher of Detroit dedicated thecornerstone of the St. Mary Student Parish church building on Sunday, April 6, 1924 at 3 o'clock in the afternoon. The Very Rev. John McNichols, S.J., president of the University of Detroit, delivered an eloquent lecture on the relation of science and faith. The cornerstone is inscribed with a cross on all six sides. The south-facing side bears the inscription "Oratorium Publicum Conceptus Immaculate B.V.M 1924," declaring the building as the "Public Oratory of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary." True to form and tradition, the cornerstone yielded a copper box, custom built and tinned by local metalworker Benjimen H. Graf. Newspaper accounts at the time declared that the box was intended "to preserve data," including a history of the chapel "and other matter of historic value."

#### What did we find in the copper box?

After 101 years in a sealed copper box, the items are in remarkably great condition. The full editions of The Ann Arbor Times News, The Michigan Catholic and The Michigan Daily were carefully folded inside the box. The copper box also held a variety of documents like the student directory of the University of Michigan, as well as coins, religious medals, and rosaries. Of special interest are a signed and dated "History of St. Mary's Chapel," by Chaplain Michael P. Bourke and a hand-written letter from architects Albert J. Rousseau and George M. McConkey that testifies to the church design. The World War I dog tag and insignia of Sgt. Gilbert Donnelly represent students who died in the war, while two colorful medals of The Apostleship of Prayer demonstrate the longstanding relationship of St. Mary Student Parish with the Society of Jesus.

When an exhibition of the items is complete, everything placed in the box in 1924 will be digitized, carefully enclosed, and deposited for consultation at the University of Michigan's Bentley Historical Library.

On April 6, 2025 at 3:00 pm, the newly filled and sealed copper box will be reinstalled in the cornerstone. Please join us for that special event.




To the exiles in Babylon, Isaiah foretells a new exodus, when the Lord will lead his people from captivity to freedom. True freedom is rooted in the person of Jesus, not in observance of the Law. It is he who challenges us to examine our own hearts before self-righteously judging others.
