BLESSED MARY

She was named Miriam (Maryam), a young woman in living in Nazareth, the daughter of Anne and Joachim. Life unfolded for her in unimaginable ways. Betrothed to a man named Joseph, she was visited by the Archangel Gabriel and told that she would conceive a child who was to be the Son of God. And for the first of what would prove to be many occasions, Mary "pondered these things in her heart."

Mary was blessed, but also very much a woman who had her own challenges and faith journey. After the visitation by Gabriel and learning of her cousin Elizabeth's pregnancy, she traveled more than 80 miles to stay with her. After her marriage, she and Joseph made the long journey to Bethlehem. Tired and exhausted she gives birth to Jesus in a manger. At the presentation in the temple, Simeon's words to the couple are filled with promise but also caution as he tells Mary, "and a sword will pierce your heart." And still later with threats from King Herod, she and Joseph flee into Egypt to save their son. It was a busy and often demanding life.

We don't know details about the days that follow as Mary and Joseph raised their Son. I like to think it was like the lives of many of us throughout the centuries filled with joy, laughter, decisions, hardships, and everyday chores. We do learn that

Mary and Joseph search for Jesus for three days when he remains in the temple, rather than return home with his family. Another one of the occasions I like to think Mary, perhaps frantic, pondered this in her heart. She continued as a presence in Jesus' life and stood at the foot of the cross, receiving his body after the crucifixion. Loving, faithful, sorrowful and in many ways determined and fearless.

Throughout her lifetime, Mary was many things to many people: daughter, prophet, cousin, loving wife and mother, faithful disciple and friend. Her life presented her with challenges that were commonplace at times, and at other times demanded the utmost trust and faith in God.

There are so many ways we can come to know Mary better and enter a relationship with her that will bring us closer to Jesus. She is available to us all and has no demands on how we come to her. Her life is rich in experiences through which we can come to know her and ask her to walk with us on our journey- in joy, daily living, sorrow, challenges and celebrations. She has witnessed and lived them all and waits with open hands and heart. She will grant us love, clarity, peace and hope. Invite her in.

I write this on the evening of Holy Thursday, and my heart bursts for the opportunity to come before the Lord in the Eucharist and receive Him there with all of you. Centennial Celebration Fall Preview - Save the Dates


- •September 21 All-Parish Outdoor Mass
