THE BEAUTY OF MARITAL GRACE

The beauty of our faith is the opportunity for God's gift of supernatural grace through the sacraments. Marriage is a sacrament in which a couple are called to the mission to build up and serve the people of God. This month, it will be 50 years since I met my husband. Having recently celebrated our 45th wedding anniversary there has been much to reflect on, and for me, it took many years before I understood both the larger picture and the true meaning of marital grace.

Brothers and sisters, consider this:

*whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly,
and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully.
Each must do as already determined, without sadness
or compulsion,
for God loves a cheerful giver.*

*Moreover, God is able to make every grace abundant
for you,*

*so that in all things, always having all you need,
you may have an abundance for every good work.*

2 Cor 9:6-8

Praying with this passage recently, I was reminded of the emotional obstacles I may experience when showing love and attention to my husband. What is the motive, why is it a struggle, am I giving to receive, or giving freely as a loving partner? Am I giving sparingly? Is my desire to give graciously (sow bountifully), without struggling (sadness or compulsion), and be a cheerful giver?

This is exactly where divine Grace is needed. I ask God for the grace to give generously. In a difficult moment I ask *please give me the grace to love him as you do Lord.* God is waiting for me to ask, and I know this because He has provided for me many a time.

A few examples of the marital grace we have experienced are being quick to forgive, quick to build each other up, accepting life's hardships, showing up for our daily prayer time, and realizing our call to serve others.

Marriage is hard, and thanks be to God, we have survived the very busy years of rearing our family, are blessed with decent health, work we love, and fulfilling ways to serve others. Our faith has grown substantially since those early years, and we gratefully celebrate every day we have together.

The sacrament of marriage which is designed by God is supported by the church. Here are a few resources:

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE FROM FR KYLE

Thank you to everyone who has contributed to the success of our capital campaign. As of July 21, 2025, we have raised \$4,082,177.59 in pledges from 451 individuals and households from our parish. We also reached a critical milestone in that we have received \$1,405,946.14 in actual donations, which means we have surpassed our parish commitment to the Stewardship for Saints and Scholars campaign for Catholic education. In other words, each and every additional dollar we receive from now on will directly benefit St. Mary Student Parish!

What this means concretely is that we can now begin the formal planning process of how to implement the repairs and improvements that are central components of our campaign. We are committed to being good stewards of the funds entrusted to us. As previously noted in the bulletin, we have formed a Facilities subcommittee, which like the existing Church Enhancement Committee, is composed of your fellow parishioners with expertise in various fields. They will help us to be prudent in how we allocate and spend the funds that we receive.

Thank you once again for your generous support and willingness to invest in the future of our community! Each parishioner who dedicated time, talent, and treasure to this campaign has planted a seed for the next generation of Catholics from the University of Michigan and the greater Ann Arbor area who will find a welcoming spiritual sanctuary at the corner of Thompson and William Streets. CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORLD : VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Saint Mary's has been blessed by the commitment of many Children's Liturgy of the Word volunteers. In the past year of offering Children's Liturgy of the Word at our 10:00 mass we have seen many fruits of this program. We are building a strong community to support the faith of our youngest members!

Children's Liturgy of the Word presents the weekly readings, creed, and prayers of the faithful for children ages 2-6. Providing a program that adapts the Liturgy of the Word for our youngest parishioners is crucial to helping children develop their relationship with God and learn to participate in the Mass. We need your help to continue to make this vital ministry possible.

We have two classes, one for 2-4 year olds (with their parents) and another for 5-6 year olds. We are asking for volunteers to help co-facilitate approximately one session per month during the academic year (September to May). Session materials will be provided, we just ask that you review them ahead of time. Middle school and high school students are also welcome to volunteer as a second catechist for the classes!

All adult volunteers must complete online safe environment training, a background check, and a code of conduct form prior to volunteering with Children's Liturgy of the Word.

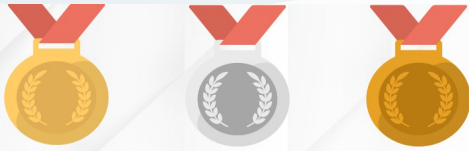
