## STUDENT LIFE AND FAITH AT ST. MARY

A Note from Bia Quintieri , Michigan Catholics Peer Ministry Intern President

Hello! My name is Bia Quintieri and I am the Michigan Catholics Peer Ministry Intern President! I am a third year undergraduate student studying Environmental Engineering with a minor in Spanish and I have been involved with St. Mary since my freshman year. I love the community I have found here and am excited to be able to give back by representing the student parishioners.

Over the course of the first few weeks back, I have been blessed to see so many new faces at our undergraduate Welcome Week events! With the 8pm Student Mass filled to capacity, we have been able to create more awareness about our events such as Glow-in-the-Dark Frisbee, a bonfire, Root Beer Pong, our annual Lu'au (accompanied this year by an interactive viewing of Moana 2), Poker Night, the Labor Day BBQ, and our Fresh Gathering for new students. Our Welcome Team, comprised of second-year students, worked hard to plan and execute these events. I also want to extend my gratitude to all the parishioners who have helped us with these events – whether supporting the undergraduate students by giving your time, talent, or financial support, we feel your encouragement and are so grateful.

Part of my role as President is working with and helping coordinate our Peer Ministry Intern Team of 11 undergraduates. This year, we have students focused on social media, retreats, prayer and liturgy/intercultural engagement, intramural sports, music, Faith Doing Justice, and Family Faith Formation, as well as three students focused on events and outreach. We've already begun planning events for the rest of the semester, including ultimate frisbee and sand volleyball teams, a fall formal dance, fall retreat, and weekly rosaries on the campus diag. We will continue to have our weekly Ig.Nite event, where undergrads attend Mass and then eat dinner together while hearing from a speaker. Our men's and women's groups have new leaders and continue to grow in size.

The men's group is emphasizing growing in faith and brotherhood, and the women's group is engaging with a modern version of the Screwtape Letters, written specifically for the struggles of modern women, called Sincerely Stoneheart by Emily Wilson Hussem. Middle Eastern Bible Study and Cristeros, our Latino/Hispanic group for students, are starting again and inviting new students to explore the intersections of faith

and cultural tradition. We also have a collection of small groups begun by students popping up, with more Bible study groups and faith groups proposed every semester.

Again, I would like to thank you all for your support of our campus ministry. St. Mary Student Parish provides students like me with an opportunity to engage in the faith on a secular campus, to find community, and to foster a stronger relationship with the Lord. This parish has played an integral role in my formation as a young adult, and with your support, we will continue to offer students on campus a place to grow into disciples of the Lord.

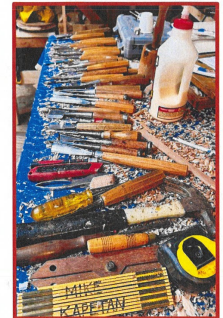

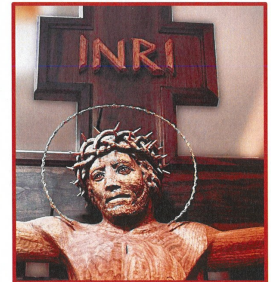

“Just as Moses lifted up the serpent, so must the Son of Man be lifted up”. “God highly exalted him” and made him Lord! How unforgettable are his deeds! This feast celebrates a double anniversary/ In Jerusalem, Constatine erected a round church, the Anastasis, above the empty grave of Jesus, ad a basilica, the Martyrium; in the square between the two churches, a shrine, Calvarium, marking the place of the crucifixion. Dedicated in 335, they were destroyed by the Persians in 614. The two churches were rebuilt by Patriarch Modestus of Jerusalem c. 626 but were later destroyed by the Muslims in 1009. The present church of the Holy Sepulcher, rebuilt by the Crusaders, was dedicated in 1149. Today also commemorates the discovery of the Lord’s cross by the empress. St. Helena (18 Aug), in 320
