WHY WE'RE HERE: A NIGHT OF SACRED STORIES

Hi everyone,

My name is Andrey Vo and I am a senior majoring in Psychology and minoring in Crime & Justice. This year, I have the amazing opportunity to serve on the Peer Ministry team as the Social Media Intern. I have had so much fun meeting students as I take pictures, which I use to create content for the Michigan Catholics social media accounts. Before college, I never imagined serving for a church in any capacity. When I had my first taste of campus ministry my freshman year, I had not been Confirmed or had my first Holy Communion yet. It was not until I started asking my peers questions about what their upbringing looked like and how they live out their faith in college, that I understood the magnitude that God can work in my life. It was touching to hear how people's experiences, from joys to sins, reflected my own. I never imagined giving the Lord my triumphs, trials, and tribulations, but hearing God's hands in the lives of others inspired me to surrender. Learning about my peers' faith made me want to grow mine. Hearing their stories was a beautiful step in navigating my own. After months of witnessing Christ in my peers' lives, I knew it was time to take my faith further. In my first-ever experience of Adoration, I knelt before Jesus in the Monstrance, praying about what to do. He showed me a vision of Him extending His hand to me, reassuring me that He has plans to give me hope and a future (Jeremiah 29:11). From that moment, I knew I was ready to become a fully initiated Catholic. I joined OCIA the next day, had my Baptism certificate sent over, and was Confirmed four months later as a freshman. Now, as a senior, God has shown me that my story matters. God called me to the Peer Ministry Internship program so I can be a witness to others at St. Mary Student Parish.

Here, each Peer Minister will share their 15 minute

testimony in why they are here at St. Mary Student Parish and what brought them to the internship. There will be three rounds of testimonies shared in four locations around the church. You can be inspired by how and why the Peer Ministers practice their Catholic faith in college, what moments of conversion made them who they are today, and how they will invite people deeper into the faith. I am so excited for how God will speak through these Peer Ministers in a special way. I cannot wait to meet you at Sacred Stories!


