## Parish Insight

### IMMIGRANT STORIES FROM OUR HISPANIC COMMUNITY - 2025

In his message for the 2025 World Day of Migrants and Refugees, Pope Leo XIV emphasizes the dignity of migrants, observing, "In a world darkened by war and injustice, even when all seems lost, migrants and refugees stand as messengers of hope. Their courage and tenacity bear heroic testimony to a faith that sees beyond what our eyes can see."

In recent months, our Hispanic immigrant community has faced wave after wave of danger, sadness, and fear. What at the beginning of the year seemed like only a looming storm has been confirmed, as several Hispanic parishioners' old deportation proceedings were reopened, and others were searched on their way to work, at their homes, and even while dropping off their children at school.

Now, not a day goes by that Hispanic immigrants are not detained, regardless of their nationality, whether or not they have pending asylum proceedings, temporary residence permits, work permits, or even green cards or naturalization.

Let me tell you just two stories of real people, parishioners of our parish, and I'll use other names and countries of origin to protect their identities:

"Juan" from Honduras was arrested after his case was reopened and deported after his right to bail was denied. He was married to "Isabel," a permanent resident. Both were parents of five children, two of whom were preparing for their First Communion. However, they continued to attend catechism classes. Last April, they received the Eucharist for the first time, and the notable absentee on this joyful day was their father.

"Maria" and "Juan" were arrested and released on bail in 2018. Unfortunately, two months ago, they were forcibly summoned to the ICE offices in Detroit, facing imminent risk of arrest. They were accompanied by their children, Fr. Pat Casey, and members of the St. Mary's immigration team. That day, they were told they had to leave the country before the end of the month—the father after 22 years of living here, and the

mother for 19. The entire family left a few days ago for their country of origin, a place with high crime rates.

These are just two stories of the many we see all the time. None of the deported parents had a criminal record; they were hard workers and practiced the Catholic faith. All of these separated families have been profoundly affected financially by the deportation of their household's main source of income, but they all have one thing in common: their deep faith and hope for reunion; their crime: the desire to provide their children with a better future.

The Hispanic community inspires in me a profound admiration for their great resilience, facing their fears every day to go to work and drop their children off at school, and even attending Mass every Sunday, taking refuge in their faith, which is the only certainty they have in their lives. This faith strengthens and spreads to the entire community, elevating it and encouraging others to come to our parish.

It is important to emphasize that God has sustained us in miraculous ways. He has placed human angels who restore hope to us every day. Without the support of each of them, we would not have been able to provide aid to all these affected families, providing them with spiritual, psychological, legal, and financial support. Without the solidarity of our parishioners in this wonderful extended St. Mary's community, we would not be able to continue moving forward and facing this difficult time.

I cannot describe the profound impact that every gesture received and all the love for our most vulnerable brothers and sisters have had on me.

My heart is full of gratitude and hope, of trust in God who does not abandon us, and never will.

## THANK YOU FOR MANY YEARS OF MINISTRY, FR. PAT

Known as Padre Patricio to many parishioners, Fr. Patrick Casey, S.J. has been a welcoming presence here at St. Mary since he arrived in 2017. Calling himself "a utility player," he touched many people, including students and especially the people of our Hispanic/Latino community. It is with grateful, but sad, hearts that we say farewell as he retires this month. He will be moving to the Colombiere Jesuit Retreat Center in Clarkston. Fr. Pat was ordained a Jesuit priest on June 8, 1972 in Chicago. After 53 years in Christian ministry, he can look back on an amazing life of service, especially during his time in Peru. He spent almost 45 years working and teaching among the poor in various towns and schools in Peru, a country he came to love.

"That's what called me to the Society [of Jesus] in the first place," he said. "The missionary aspect of it."

It would turn out to be a job that he treasured – working with people who he found to be very close to God through their poverty, their simplicity and their love of family, community, and each other.

"It's a beautiful place," he said. "The people are wonderful. The way they help one another, their solidarity – they taught me a lot."

Fr. Pat returned to the U.S. in 2011, mainly due to health conditions. He left with sadness, but found a new home here in Ann Arbor. His fluency in Spanish made him a good candidate for leading the Hispanic/Latino ministry here.

Looking back on his years as a priest, he has a few thoughts on work, life and faith.

Things always worked best when he "put himself in God's hands" and allowed himself to go where God was leading him.

If you're ever tempted to wonder if our faith is real, or if God is truly active in our lives, just listen to people sharing about their faith, and how God has sustained them in troubled times.

God always helps us make a way forward, even when we don't have the skills or experience to do something. "I know I had my deficiencies in doing some things, but God always managed to make up for them," he said. "God always helped me find a team of people who were very capable and it worked out well."

Overall, Fr. Pat says he mostly feels gratitude. "It's been a very good life – a very grace-filled life, and I'm very grateful for it."

We will miss you, Fr. Pat, and hope you know that you go with our prayers and heartfelt thanks!

### Did you know these fun facts about St. Mary Student Parish over the past 100 years?

The chapel is recognized in Ann Arbor's historic preservation efforts: e.g. it was referenced in the 2025 Ann Arbor Historic Preservation Awards, noting its design by Rousseau and its "unusual Art Deco" character.

A Newman Club was organized at the Chapel in 1930. Taking its name from the famous English Catholic theologian of the 19th century, the first Newman Club had originated at the University of Pennsylvania in 1893 and soon spread westward. The purpose of the Club at the University of Michigan was "to sponsor the educational and social phases of the Chapel program."

Originally it was called St. Mary Student Chapel. In the early 1970s it changed its name to St. Mary Student Parish.
