ENDING THE YEAR WITH HOPE – JOIN US AT OUR PARISH RETREAT

How are we doing in placing our trust in God these days? Does it seem harder to hold onto hope?

Perhaps a little time away with God can help. This theme of hope (“We are Pilgrims of Hope”) will be front and center at our upcoming Bilingual Parish Retreat next month. Before his death, Pope Francis laid things out for us, when he declared a Jubilee Year of Hope in January. As 2025 winds down, our staff has seen that many people are struggling to maintain hope in our chaotic world. To this, we want to say, keep focusing on the deep love that Christ has for each of us.

Jesus, the real source of our hope, told us to keep our eyes on him – and on what’s lasting and eternal. The things of the world, including our immediate struggles, “will all pass away,” Jesus tells us. “My words will never pass away.” (Matthew 24:35)

It’s easy to get caught up in our worldly pursuits and values, but Jesus has always showed us a different, more humble way. Saints and mystics, including one of my favorites, Julian of Norwich, can provide clarity. “All shall be well... all manner of things shall be well,” she wrote – even as the plague was ravaging her country and city.

Our greatest saint, Mother Mary, gave us the Magnificat to remind us how God turns things upside down (upends our worldly values) to give us what we need most.

“For he who is mighty has done great things for me...

He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty.” (Luke 1: 49, 53)

And Pope Francis has another tip for building hope: We must work toward a “culture of encounter,” he wrote. Connecting with others, and lifting each other up helps us to know that we are not alone. We can truly find and hear God through others, whether we are praying together, or maybe helping to take care of others through one of our Faith Doing Justice efforts. Encountering others can bring light in a dark world.

If you’re in need of a little extra hope these days, join us at our Ignatian retreat weekend – November 7th through 9th at the Colombiere Jesuit Retreat Center in Clarkston. A parish team has been working hard to offer talks, prayer opportunities, and time for connection and “encounter.” And there’s Yoga with Fr. Bob-by too!
