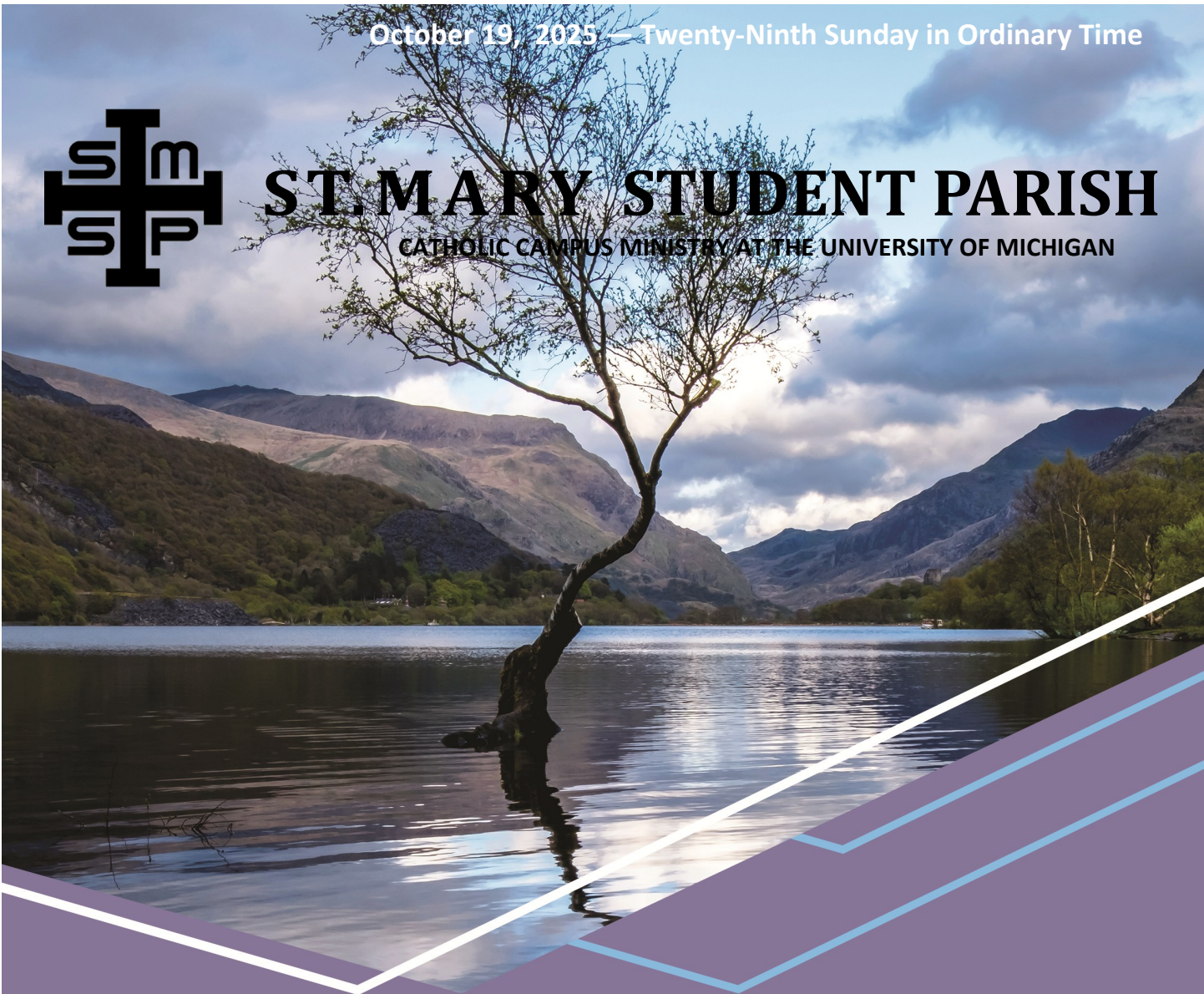

SAVORING GOD'S GRACE

Nearly a month ago, we celebrated our All-Parish Centennial Mass. As I processed onto the field and gazed upon the stands filled with those who have been parishioners for decades as well as Freshmen recently arrived in Ann Arbor, I marveled at the beautiful tapestry of generations, cultures, and perspectives God has brought together in our parish community. So, as I began my homily, I encouraged us to take a moment to savor the graces of the occasion, or as Saint Ignatius Loyola puts it at the start of the Spiritual Exercises, “el sentir y el gustar de las cosas internamente,” to allow ourselves to taste and feel those graces deep within us.

As human beings, it is so easy for us to focus on the negative, our failures, all that is broken in our world. When we do so, we miss the abundant graces God showers on us each day. Since we took the opportunity to savor the moment at the All-Parish Mass, when showers did literally fall upon us, we could see them as graces from above as opposed to “rain on our parade.” In today’s Gospel, Jesus asks, “when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?” and after our All-Parish Mass, I can confidently say, “yes,” as I witnessed a stadium overflowing with the profound faith of over a thousand Saint Mary Student Parish residents and students.

Our faith is a gift and when we savor this gift, this grace, we come to appreciate how blessed we are to have received it. A wise friend once observed, “la fe, si no avanza, retrocede,” which means that faith must either move forward or backward. In other words, in order to be good stewards of the gift of faith, we must actively cultivate it or else we risk losing it. Back in January, Father Dan introduced the basic pillars of our new parish strategic plan in a bulletin article -

invite, engage, and deepen. Over these past nine months, I hope that these concepts have germinated within us, so that they can help us cultivate our faith together as a community.

Invite. While some of us may have been invited directly by God to come to St. Mary, I imagine that most of us received an invitation from a family member, neighbor, or friend. When we step out of our comfort zone to invite someone to St. Mary, we actively share our faith with them and welcome them into a community where we hope they experience God’s mercy and love.

Engage. Each one of us has a unique story to share, no matter how young or how old, both townies and recent arrivals. Each one of us has unique gifts that we bring to our parish community. When we take the time to engage with one another, to enter into dialogue and to learn from one another, we come together as one body and encounter Christ in each other.

Deepen. Saint Ignatius Loyola’s phrase, “el sentir y el gustar de las cosas internamente,” is a call to move beyond the surface in order to plumb the depths of God’s abundant graces. When we make the effort to deepen our faith and foster the growth of this cherished gift, we will witness the fruits of faith that you have been given, in and through our community at St. Mary.

How is God calling you to invite, to engage, and to deepen?

A great opportunity to savor God’s grace and deepen your faith would be to join us for our parish retreat from November 7-9!

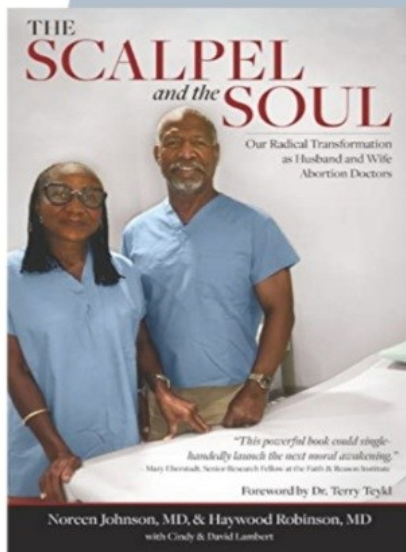
