A CULTURE OF 'ENCOUNTER'

At that time, Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town.

Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature.

So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way.

When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly,

for today I must stay at your house."

And he came down quickly and received him with joy.

(Luke 19:1-6)

Zacchaeus, the unjust tax collector in our gospel today, experiences a radical change after having a personal encounter with Jesus.

We can assume he came to the center of town with a curiosity about Jesus. He had probably heard about Jesus' preaching, and especially his miracles of healing. He was "seeking to see" this guy for himself.

We don't know if Zacchaeus had been contemplating his corrupt past and was already working on changing his ways. We do know that Jesus personally took notice and called him out of the crowd. And suddenly, it changed everything. The seeker became a follower.

The importance of "encountering" Jesus, and then imitating Jesus is echoed by Pope Francis in his autobiography, called "Hope," published not long before his death. To maintain our hope, Francis says, it helps if we strive for a "culture of encounter." We must lift each other up and take care of those most in need. Pope Francis wrote:

"We must allow ourselves to encounter life and God. I dream of a Church that is more and more a mother and shepherdess, in which its ministers know how to be merciful, how to take care of others, how to look after them like the Good Samaritan. God is greater than the sinner, always. This is the Gospel."

Here is another thought relating to our gospel passage, reminding us that we should be seekers, curious to see and encounter God's goodness, just like Zacchaeus.

"God is training us our whole lives to experience the divine. God takes us by the hand, as it were, and tries to get us to open our eyes through the Spirit. I hope that we may learn, here and now, to see God in the physical creation around us but also in everything we do. And not only to recognize the presence of God, but to see this life as the beginning of our eternal life."

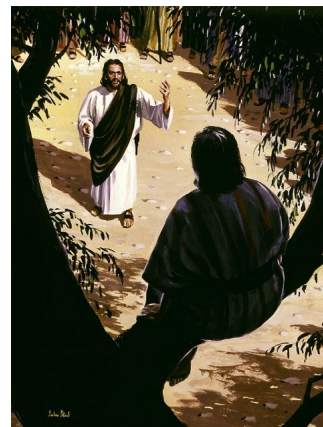

And we can ask ourselves this week:

What might I need to "come down" from in my life? (As Jesus asks Zacchaeus to "come down" from his tree). Do I have obstacles in my life, an attachment to power, money, unhealthy habits, etc. that keep me from putting God at the center of my life?

How can the example of Zacchaeus help me to feel more hopeful and loved? How can I do more to simply want to be with the Lord?

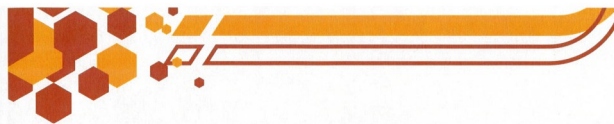
