FAITH IN ACTION: SERVING AT THE MEN'S OVERNIGHT SHELTER

Hi everyone, my name is David Caballero, and I am a junior here studying Economics and Spanish. Last year, I was the Faith Doing Justice Intern, and I worked a lot with the FDJ team. One of the larger projects that we at St. Mary's undertake is the Men's overnight shelter. This is when St. Mary's accepts 20-30 men experiencing homelessness and gives them shelter for some nights. I am here to share a little bit about my experience volunteering and to ask you to sign up to volunteer this year.

A huge part of my faith journey has been through service and seeing Jesus through the marginalized. This experience was unlike any other I had been part of in the past. Because we are housing them, these men come in after long days and are just grateful to be able to be part of this program. Being able to facilitate that gift is a special thing, but you experience even more when you volunteer and meet them where they are. Oftentimes, many of the men do not want to talk and just want to sleep because they are so tired. But many times, volunteering here, I was able to have great conversations, which ranged from talking about Jared Goff and the Lions to talking about how they got to where they are. It was just extremely powerful listening to them tell their stories. But even more than that was seeing how dehumanized many of these men had been. Because they were experiencing homelessness, many of them talked about the horrible comments

people have made toward them and how most people will not even acknowledge their presence. You could see it in their eyes and body language how this dehumanization affected them to the core. They were so appreciative of just a simple conversation or just a simple hello and some eye contact. That struck me to my core. So now I am here to encourage you, step out of your comfort zone, seek Jesus through service, and sign up to help out. Whether it is the overnight shift or just helping with breakfast and dinner, anything helps. If you can not volunteer, that is perfectly fine; send your prayers for all those involved.

Foco: Sainthood on Fire

Meditations on the Life of Igino Giordani

An Evening with Dr. William Calvo-Quirós, American Studies, UMich.

Tuesday, November 18, 2025 | 6:00–9:00 PM

Did you know that the University of Michigan has an alumnus who is in the process of canonization? This "modern saint" was a parishioner at Saint Mary's, having attended UMich from 1927 and 1928.

Igino Giordani, known as "Foco," was a distinguished Catholic intellectual, writer, and politician who dedicated his life to faith, scholarship, and service. A World War I veteran, he authored over 200 works on Church history and helped modernize the Vatican Library. After World War II, he served as a congressman and directed *Fides*, a major Catholic journal that shaped Italy's postwar political landscape. Most notably, Giordani co-founded a global Catholic lay movement that influenced Vatican II's vision for lay participation in the Church. In his later years, he championed ecumenism, interfaith dialogue, peace, and unity.

Forty-five years after his passing, we are invited to reflect on Giordani's example and what it teaches us about living our Catholic faith in today's world. Join Dr. William Calvo-Quirós, Associate Professor and scholar of Catholic Studies, for an evening of reflection on Giordani's enduring legacy.
