Parish Insight

A FRESHMAN'S JOURNEY TO SEEK

Hi! My name is Brooklynn Meissner, and I am a freshman here at the University of Michigan studying secondary education. I heard about the SEEK 2026 trip through an email from St. Mary's. I honestly had no idea what SEEK was, but I did a little research and decided to take a chance and go.

I learned that SEEK is a conference with over 16,000 Catholics in attendance, the majority of them college students. The conference featured many different talks from very well-known speakers and countless other faithful Catholics. I got to attend Mass and hear keynote speakers alongside Michigan Catholics and the 16,000+ others at the conference, which was truly beautiful. Seeing so many people my age so devoted, excited to learn more about their faith, and coming together to adore Jesus was so powerful.

Something that was priceless to me was being able to learn about fellow Michigan Catholic students on a deeper level as a freshman. Growing within this community has been something beautiful; you can truly see Jesus and His love in every student and it makes you want to be the best disciple you can be. We were brought together through laughter, meaningful conversations, and wisdom that I learned from other students (especially upperclassmen). So not only was SEEK a great space for learning about Jesus, but SEEK was also such a unique and powerful way to bring me closer to my peers!

Although I was surrounded by such a big and energetic community, the experience still felt very personal to me. I was able to choose which talks to attend that would best support my individual walk with the Lord. One talk that in particular stuck out to me was the "Fully Alive - A Biblical Vision for Womanhood" by Father Josh Johnson. Father did great at explaining identity and how it can be misinterpreted to make us think our lives only start once we reach certain milestones. This experience is something I will carry with me throughout the rest of my freshman year and beyond. While SEEK helped me grow in countless ways in my personal life, one takeaway from my SEEK experience was the reminder that every person we come into contact with is impacted by us. Our words, actions, and presence can leave a positive or negative mark on others. Even if someone may never come to know Jesus directly, we still have the opportunity to show them His fruits and His love through the way we live and love those around us. SEEK truly reminded me to be more intentional in my everyday life and to strive to reflect the same love, patience, and grace that Jesus so freely shares with me—in every interaction I have.



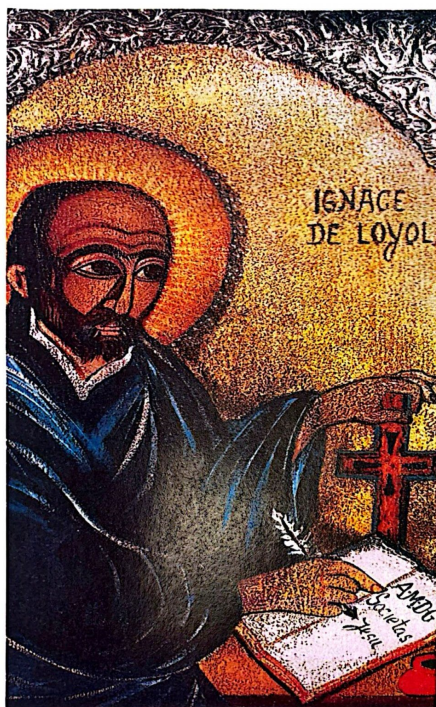
