### BAPTISM OF THE LORD – SAVORING OUR ‘THIN MOMENTS’

In just a few months, we will celebrate adult Baptism with 15 catechumens who have been preparing through our OCIA gatherings (our total OCIA group is almost 50 strong)!

We’ve been talking about what Baptism means and especially the graces of being a follower, a friend, of Christ. And what it requires, too. Jesus seemed to understand the solemn importance of setting out to begin his ministry. He kicked things off, so to speak, with a ritual action that shakes the heavens. He submits to baptism. He surrenders his life to serving those who will come his way (and those of us who will be lifted up and saved in the future).

But we tend to wonder, “why did Jesus need to be baptized? He had no sin that needed cleansing, right?”

Scripture scholars remind us that Jesus’ action is a model for us. He submits to always seeking the Father’s will, and he prayerfully stays open, asking for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit to guide him. But this gospel also shows us that something momentous is happening here.

Matthew tells us that the heavens were opened for him.

*“The veil that separates the heavenly realm from the earthly is pulled back. The gap between God and creation is shortened. The baptism of Jesus shakes heavenly realities loose and allows them to spill out onto the earth.” (Prayer Time- Cycle A, Renew International)*

Several authors call these experiences “thin moments” or “thin spaces.” These are times or places when there’s hardly any distance between the divine and our human world - moments when God breaks through and lets us know that God’s grace

and presence is flowing through everything in our world – and even within each of us.

Author Anne Lamott sometimes refers to these as “skinny threads,” or fleeting moments of grace that can help guide us and give us “sustenance.” It may not always happen with the drama of today’s gospel. We don’t always see the heavens ripped open and the Holy Spirit descending in the form of a dove (a symbol of gentleness and peace).

But we can still see God descending on us in many forms. Maybe it’s the smaller, simpler moments, like my baby granddaughter smiling with full gums, a golden sunset, a sleepy purring cat. Or maybe we realize that God has reached down and grabbed us through someone else’s care and kindness. These are gifts – times when God says, “hey look at this beautiful thing I did! I gave you this because I love you, and by the way, I’m right here with you.”

And God is always calling us, as our first reading today reminds us. He “grasps us by the hand” and wants to lead us out of the “dungeons” of our dark world and safely toward the light. The intersection between heaven and earth is not so uncommon. We just need to pay attention, and we can ask, “where did I see God today?”

And by the way, if you’d like to pray for one of our catechumens this semester, send me an email and I’ll provide you with a name. Then perhaps at Easter, you can send them a note letting them know you’ve been praying, and congratulating them for their willingness to listen hard – to hear God’s voice among the noise.
