Parish Insight

ST. MARY WELCOMES THE DAYTIME WARMING CENTER

Each winter, St. Mary hosts the Daytime Warming Center (DWC) during the month of January. For those who are unfamiliar or new to the parish, the DWC provides temporary shelter, food, clothing, and community to individuals who are unhoused during the hours of 8am and 4pm, Monday through Friday. This low barrier shelter opens its doors to anyone who needs a warm and safe place during the day.

For over a decade St. Mary has been committed to supporting this important ministry, perhaps because St. Mary was instrumental in giving the DWC its start. For those who were living in Southeastern Michigan (or anywhere in the northern Midwest) during the winter of 2013-2014, you will recall the polar vortex which brought record breaking low temperatures, with some as low as -21 degrees during the month of January, according to the National Weather Service. At this time, Camp Take Notice, a self-governing encampment of individuals who were unhoused, was also evicted from their encampment off Wagner Road in Ann Arbor.

Together, these events spurred conversations between parishioner and founder of Mercy House, Peggy Lynch, community organizer, Sheri Wander, (both of whom had built friendships with members of the encampment) and a Jesuit priest at St. Mary, Fr. Dan Reim. These conversations about how to keep people safe resulted in Fr. Dan Reim's support to open St. Mary to serve as a day shelter to anyone in need of a safe and warm place during the day. Over the years, other congregations have joined the effort, opening their doors for the DWC to provide shelter from November through March.

I highlight this not only because it's an incredible part of our St. Mary's history that we should take pride in and continue to be inspired by, but also because it's a powerful witness to our Catholic faith at its best and what it means to be people of love, compassion, mercy, and hope. Each time we open our doors to host the DWC, God invites us to continue to be a witness to God's love and friendship, often in ways that feel small and ordinary. Whether serving lunch to guests with a smile and a kind word, mending torn clothes, inviting guests to do a puzzle, or taking time to be fully present to a

guest and engage in conversation, each of these are gestures of love that affirm the dignity of our guests and lay the groundwork for friendships to be built that have the power to transform us and our world.

If you have not yet visited the shelter this season, I encourage you to stop in and be curious about what God wants to show you there. The shelter is in operation between 8am and 4pm, Monday through Friday, and will be at St. Mary through Friday, January 30. Reach out to Julia Novotny jnovotny@smspnewman.org with questions.


