DISCIPLE MAKER INDEX SURVEY

As a St. Mary parishioner and staff member, I'm grateful to be part of such a welcoming and vibrant community, where residents and students show their love for our parish in many ways. While a simple survey may seem small, every parishioner's voice matters, and your feedback will help us grow together.

From February 17 through March 31, our parish will take part in the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Survey, with a special launch weekend on February 21–22. This survey is an important moment for our parish to pause, reflect, and look forward together.

Two years ago, St. Mary began a strategic planning process that helped shape where we are today. Through listening and discernment, we identified three key pillars (Evangelization, Encounter and Stewardship) that guide our mission and our daily work as a parish community. These pillars have influenced many of our decisions, including the actions we took during our Centennial Year and the planning of our Capital Campaign. The Disciple Maker Index played an important role in that process, helping us listen to the lived experience of our parishioners.

Today, we are invited once again to reflect and share. The first step in this new phase is to assess our greatest strengths and our opportunities for growth. This is where the Disciple Maker Index comes in. The DMI is a trusted survey tool used by many parishes to better understand how people are growing as disciples of Christ.

The Disciple Maker Index is designed to:

- Invite parishioners to reflect on their personal journey of discipleship
- Help parish leadership make thoughtful, data-driven decisions
- Support parishioners in growing deeper in their faith

The survey takes about 10 to 15 minutes to complete and will be available online from February 17 through March 31. It asks questions about your own spiritual growth and your experience of how St. Mary supports you in your relationship with Christ. All responses are completely confidential. The parish will only receive results for the community as a whole, not individual answers.

For those who are not able to complete the survey online, paper copies will be available. We want to make sure every voice can be heard.

Your participation truly matters. By taking the time to complete the DMI, you are helping St. Mary Student Parish continue to grow as a welcoming, caring and diverse community. Together, we are called to embrace Christ's vision for discipleship, so our parish can thrive and remain a place where students, families, and all members can grow together in faith.

We look forward to sharing the survey link with you closer to the launch weekend. Thank you for walking this journey with us and for helping shape the future of St. Mary Student Parish. Please continue to pray for this intention and for the growth and protection of our parish.



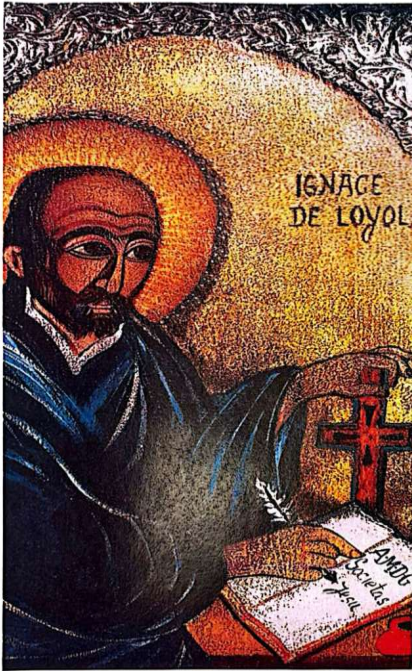
