Parish Insight

LENT 2026: THIRD WEEK OF THE SPIRITUAL EXERCISES

The Spiritual Exercises of Saint Ignatius Loyola are divided into four “weeks,” which are not defined as periods of seven days, but rather as distinct parts of this spiritual retreat, which is meant to foster spiritual freedom so that retreatants may love and serve God more deeply in their daily lives. Perhaps the most relevant of these four “weeks” to our Lenten journey is the Third Week, when we are called to accompany Our Lord Jesus Christ through His Passion and death and when Saint Ignatius invites us to ask God for the grace to experience in the depths of our hearts the sorrow, compassion, and shame that Jesus endures for our sins and because of His unconditional love for us.

We are called to reflect on Our Lord’s physical pain and human suffering and how Jesus experiences abandonment by His followers, betrayal by His closest friends, and complete and utter loneliness. Such reflection leads us to ask why God must suffer and why God allows evil to exist. Such reflection also helps us to recognize how Christ continues to suffer His Passion in the pain and suffering of the poor and the marginalized, our sisters and brothers in our community, in our nation, and throughout our world. For as Our Lord declared in the Gospel of Matthew (Mt 25:40), “Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.”

Through our reflection, we come to appreciate how, “we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin” (Hebrews 4:15). There is no amount of pain or suffering that Our Lord cannot relate to, no amount of pain and suffering that Our Lord has not experienced in His own human flesh. In this way, the Third Week of the Spiritual Exercises offers us the opportunity to unite not only our suffering, but the suffering of the entire world to Jesus’ Passion. When we unite our suffering to Our Lord’s Passion, we participate in the history of salvation and our suffering becomes redemptive.

When we offer our suffering to God, we tap into His redemptive power, which transforms meaningless pain into a cooperation with Jesus’ saving work. This redemptive power gives us the strength to not only carry our own crosses, but also to help our

sisters and brothers to carry their crosses. As we carry our crosses and follow the Lord, we express our firm hope that the joy of the Resurrection will follow the Passion, that God triumphs over evil and death. Pope Leo expressed how, “The Lord Jesus alone brings us true peace and joy and fulfills every one of our deepest desires.” So, let us walk with Our Lord this Lent in order that we might experience with Him the joy of the Resurrection.
