MY ALTERNATIVE SPRING BREAK EXPERIENCE

I was fortunate enough to go to the Los Angeles trip for this year's Alternative Spring Break (ASB). I didn't have any plans (and usually don't) and it didn't take too much convincing from some close friends, Chip and Alex, from my Christian fraternity, Beta Upsilon Chi (BYX), to rope me in this trip; but little did I know coming into this, I was heavily underestimating the value this trip had to offer

I grew up in a Catholic household and learned the basics of our faith by going to Catholic private schools. It wasn't until high school that I was exposed to Catholic Social Teaching. It was important learning those principles, but the only issue was that I never had the opportunity to devote and live out those teachings that reflect our Christian lifestyle to serve others.

ASB provided that opportunity and it brought such a unique and unforgettable experience. There are many takeaways I can share here, but I think the main takeaway and best way to describe it is "witnessing Christ in Conflict and Community." Our group had many opportunities to see that. We walked around Skid Row, labeled as one of the poorest and dangerous neighborhoods with the highest concentration of homeless people. We toured Homeboy Industries, the largest ex-gang reentry program west of the Mississippi. We cooked meals for the Guadalupe Homeless Project (GHP), a program that supports unhoused refugees. We spent time with students in Dolores Mission and IMPACTO, a Catholic school and afterschool program for children in East LA.

All of these events on paper sound great, but the colorful, intentional, human aspect is what makes this so incredibly unique, and that's where I truly witnessed Christ in these communities. We handed out water bottles and received gratitude for not just the bottles but also the simple and kind "thank you for stopping by!" all around in the Skid Row scene. We were consistently welcomed by members, who were once in the gang life, in this vibrant and loving community at Homeboy Industries. We ate with those in GHP and heard their stories. We surrounded ourselves with joy from the next generation who will take responsibility too. Despite everything that was or is labeled in a negative way,

there is so much love, and that has been made possible through the presence of the Holy Spirit.

The overwhelming connection, community, and JOY. It was a culture shock. Christ shocked me the way he is present in these communities. As I've grown up in my life, I've noticed on paper and realized more and more how much sin, struggle, and separation there is in the world. It saddens my heart. But to see Christ working in these communities reveals truth and hope. It is a matter of following Christ's example and seeking unity to cure all. That's the best way I could describe it all.

To my fellow folks that may consider ASB, I don't think reading a testimonial is enough to understand this overwhelming sense of community and joy. You have to go out there and experience it first-hand. The human aspect is a key ingredient to witness Christ in action. Grateful for this opportunity, for those who planned this, and for this brotherhood who came along with me in this journey. Thank you.

Be kind. Do good. Represent Christ well.

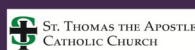

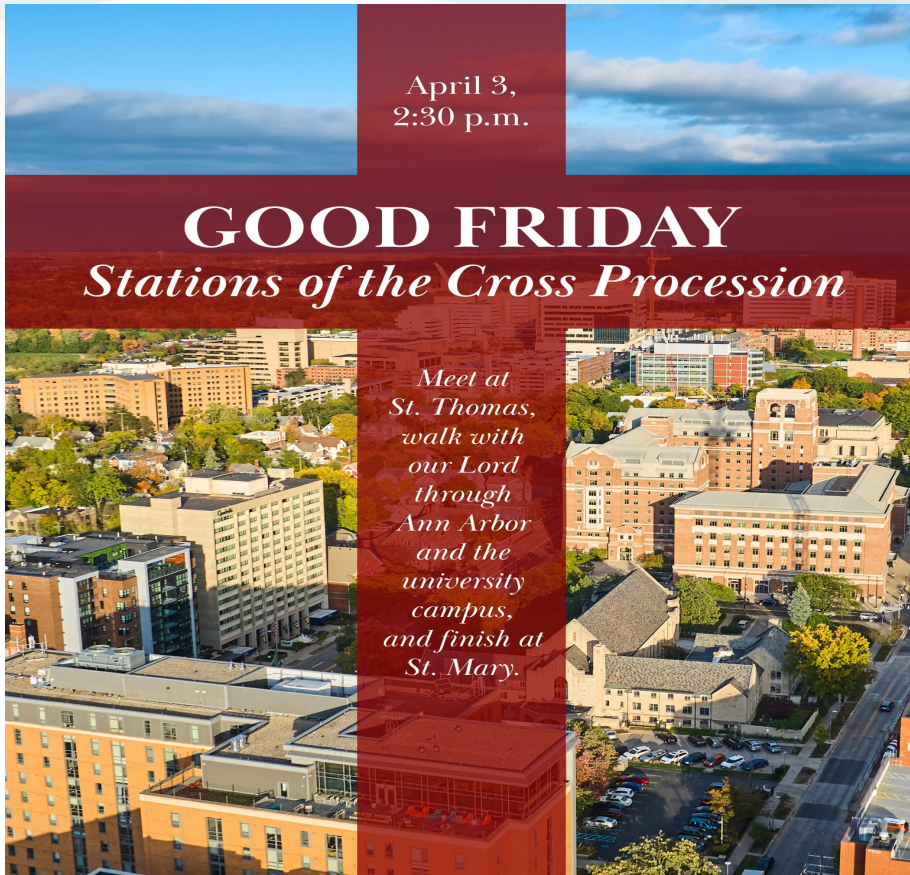
