HOLY WEEK - OUR CALL TO WALK WITH CHRIST

In the “Call of the King” meditation from the Spiritual Exercises of Saint Ignatius Loyola, we are asked to consider our response if we were to find ourselves before Our Lord Jesus Christ, and before Him all the entire world, and then hear Jesus’ call each of us individually. The late Father David Fleming, SJ, offered the following contemporary interpretation of this call of Christ: “It is my will to win over the whole world, to overcome evil with good, to turn hatred aside with love, to conquer all the forces of death—whatever obstacles there are that block the sharing of life between God and humankind. Whoever wishes to join me in this mission must be willing to labor with me, and so by following me in struggle and suffering may share with me in glory.”

When I have prayed with this meditation during my annual retreat, I initially find the Lord’s invitation quite inspiring and encouraging – after all, who would not want to overcome evil with good, turn aside hatred with love, in order to reconcile humankind with God? Then, I get to that last line – “so by following me in struggle and suffering may share with me in glo-

ry.” We naturally seek to avoid struggle and suffering. More often that we probably would want to admit, we can be like the palm-waving crowds as Jesus enters Jerusalem, eager to cheer Him on as we stand by the roadside, yet who are then nowhere to be found when Our Lord endures His Passion, when He is tortured and ridiculed, when He ultimately dies upon the cross for our sins.

So, once again, the Lord issues His call to each of us this Holy Week, to not merely stand by the wayside as He moves towards His Passion, but rather to walk with Him, to accompany Him in His struggle and suffering, which we witness as we encounter the face of Christ in those who suffer poverty and injustice, violence and oppression. Jesus invites us to enter this week with our whole hearts, to allow our hearts to be moved by His humble service in the washing of the feet and His self-gift in the Eucharist on Holy Thursday, to allow our hearts to be broken as we witness His abandonment, rejection, and death on Good Friday, and to allow our hearts to be enkindled with hope as we witness His Resurrection at Easter, so we might share in His glory.


