CALLED TO NEW LIFE IN THE SPIRIT

“Through Christ you have granted us rebirth in the Spirit.” (Prayer for Holy Saturday)

A few weeks ago, we read the gospel account of Jesus raising his friend, Lazarus, from the dead. With compassion, he calls Lazarus to “come forth,” out of the darkness of death. He says the same to each of us, inviting us always to walk in the light, with him at our side.

In this joyful season of Resurrection, we too, can open our eyes and see Jesus, the one who conquers death, right there beside us. He is the one who continues to walk with us on the road – through whatever we encounter along the way.

For the past 12 years, I’ve had the privilege of hearing the unique stories of how God has touched the hearts of people entering the church. They feel and hear God’s voice calling them forth, even when they aren’t exactly sure what it is.

This year, we had the largest OCIA group in a decade. They all responded to that voice, and we celebrated the Easter Sacraments with them this weekend at the Easter Vigil Mass. **Nine people were baptized** into the faith. We also welcomed and confirmed another 30 adults (including 11 from another Christian faith).

We congratulate their dedication and their desire to build a true relationship with God. We thank them for joining us, and for bringing their own unique gifts that help to renew the Church. May their “rebirth in the spirit” bring them a lifetime of hope, joy and peace.

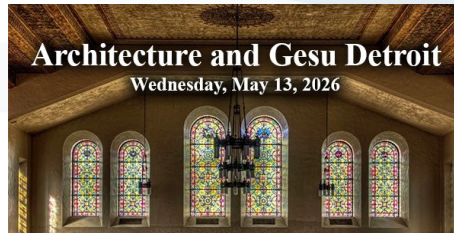

JESUIT FRIENDS AND ALUMNI NETWORK (JFAN) DETROIT: ARCHITECTURE AND GESU DETROIT

Join Jesuit friends and alumni on **Wednesday, May 13, 2026** for a wine and cheese reception at the historic Gesu Catholic Church. The evening will feature the history, families, art, and architecture of the parish founded by Jesuits in 1922 and once home to four Detroit mayors, several congressmen and the renowned Fisher Brothers. This event will share rare architectural drawings and antique stained-glass windows design – some dating back to the late 1800s from two Detroit families who long worked with the Jesuits and the Archdiocese of Detroit. The two families behind the firms of Diehl & Diehl Architects and Detroit Stained Glass Works shaped our city's sacred spaces.

Special guests include Paul G. Diehl, grandson of original architect George F. Diehl and descended from the founders of Detroit Stained Glass Works; Patricia Montemurri, award-winning journalist; and Mary Clare McCormick, Detroit Sacred Art archivist. The evening will include a Mass, wine and cheese reception, and a tour of this historic worship site.
