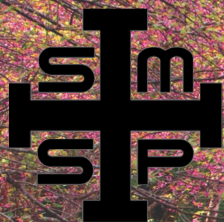

Parish Insight

BE BOLD: A WORKSHOP FOR TEENAGERS

Be Bold is a workshop created based on a "Youth Encounter" program for teenagers originally held in the United States. It was translated into Spanish by a Salesian priest, introduced in Peru during the 1980s, and subsequently spread with great success to various countries throughout Latin America.

Adolescence is a stage of life that presents many challenges for us parents; our children undergo hormonal and physical changes that lead to shifts in their behavior and social interactions.

Consequently, our teenagers begin to notice our flaws; we cease to be the figures they once admired or obeyed without question. Suddenly, they begin to challenge our judgment; comparisons with other parents arise, and a phase begins in which our children demand greater independence. In the worst-case scenarios, the teenager begins to withdraw, and communication starts to dwindle. If we parents make the mistake of being overly authoritarian, our teenager may rebel, and eventually, our parent-child relationship will begin to fracture.

On the other hand, as believers, we are convinced that our faith is a gift—a valuable legacy we wish for our children to embrace. Yet, it is precisely during adolescence that our children often begin to gradually drift away from God and no longer wish to accompany us to Church.

That is why we recognized the need to create *Be Bold*—a dedicated space designed to accompany our teenagers as they discover their inherent worth as young people coming into their own. We wanted to provide a place where they could find validation for their feelings and thoughts, and be reminded of the vital importance of communication, family bonds, and true friendship. Our goal is to affirm that a sense of belonging is crucial at this age, and to help them come to view Jesus as their very best friend.

Be Bold is a unique workshop—a dedicated effort to minister to our children during this pivotal and crucial stage of their lives. This year marks our fifth workshop at St Mary's. Although convincing teenagers to sign up is always a challenge, we remain hopeful that parents will encourage them to participate in this unforgettable experience—one that will provide families with a shared space to connect and to affirm a love that must never be lost, least of all during the adolescent years.

"Be Bold" is a bilingual workshop; the leaders communicate with the young participants in English, and the program unfolds amidst games, songs, and personal testimonies shared by the accompanying guides. 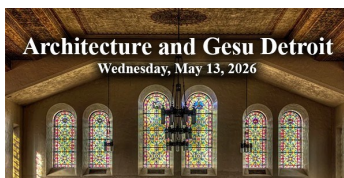
The Kateri Institute Presents: Medieval Theology and Modern ChatBots

JESUIT FRIENDS AND ALUMNI NETWORK (JFAN) DETROIT: ARCHITECTURE AND GESU DETROIT

Join Jesuit friends and alumni on **Wednesday, May 13, 2026** for a wine and cheese reception at the historic Gesu Catholic Church. The evening will feature the history, families, art, and architecture of the parish founded by Jesuits in 1922 and once home to four Detroit mayors, several congressmen and the renowned Fisher Brothers. This event will share rare architectural drawings and antique stained-glass windows design – some dating back to the late 1800s from two Detroit families who long worked with the Jesuits and the Archdiocese of Detroit. 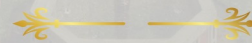
