## Parish Insight

### A CALL TO CARE FOR CREATION

Before you read on, I encourage you to take a minute to step outside, feel the wind, hear the birds, watch the trees start to grow leaves. What do you notice? What brings you joy?

Such moments of connection are small, but I believe they are necessary. Since the first Earth Day 56 years ago, carbon dioxide in the atmosphere has increased by over thirty percent, and we have experienced record high temperatures and more frequent natural disasters. This is all happening as we fall farther out of harmony with our local ecosystems. We can see the start of this disconnection reflected in the beginning of Genesis, when Adam (whose name means “from the ground”) and Eve take what isn’t theirs, damaging their relationship with God and falling out of Eden, thus subjecting future generations to a life of strife caused by their action. Similarly, when we chose to consume what we didn’t need, release fossil fuels into the atmosphere, and clear vast areas of land rich in biodiversity, we damaged our relationship with our planet and fell from our former state of harmony, and now we’re experiencing the consequences through worsening natural disasters. Our younger generations have to live with that ecological sin, suffering the health consequences that come from disconnection from Earth while being given the nearly insurmountable task of fixing the planet. But, with God, nothing is insurmountable. And even when it feels hopeless, we can see God’s grace in Earth’s abundance. Even while the planet is suffering for everything we’ve done, Earth still provides food for us to eat, air for us to breathe, and beautiful natural places to enjoy. Despite the harm we’ve caused, God is still caring for us through Earth’s abundance. And that is why I believe, despite the sometimes overwhelming environmental devastation, that there is hope for Earth and humanity — Jesus died for us, as Earth continues to provide for us, because we are never beyond salvation. And someday, through God’s grace, we can reach a state of harmony with our planet and ecosystems again.

Averting climate change may feel like an uphill battle, but we are not alone. After all, Jesus lived with the mission of saving the world. Climate change may be our generation’s cross to

bear, but He is still with us along the journey. And we can start by restoring our personal relationships with Creation in our own lives, which can strengthen our relationships with God and each other. After all, we are not separate from nature, and we are all part of the masterpiece that God has created. A tree alone is susceptible to falling, but in a forest, the diversity of species strengthens them all; a person alone may struggle, but together, we can create change. So when we preserve natural areas, we give ourselves the space to slow down and reflect, and when we build community, we reduce waste by sharing resources. Solving climate change is not just a challenge but also a solution to society’s struggles if we work together. In the end, the most important Commandments Jesus gives us are to love God and to love each other, and we experience God’s love through the planet. Going forward, how will we choose to return it?

## What is the purpose of the Diocesan Services Appeal (DSA)?

The DSA is an annual appeal, meaning gifts are used to sustain the ongoing, day-to-day work of the Church in our diocese. Your DSA gifts are put to work right away in a multitude of ministries and activities. The dollars are not invested or reserved for future use.

## What's the difference between DSA and Stewardship for Saints and Scholars gifts?

DSA gifts support the efforts of the many ongoing ministries across the diocese. Stewardship for Saints and Scholars gifts are a long-term investment in the future of Catholic schools and the education and formation of our children. Campaign gifts are used for purposes entirely different than the uses of DSA contributions. Both types of gifts are necessary and responsible uses of the financial gifts with which God has graced us as the stewards of His Holy Catholic Church.

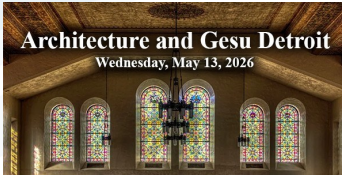

### JESUIT FRIENDS AND ALUMNI NETWORK (JFAN) DETROIT: ARCHITECTURE AND GESU DETROIT

Join Jesuit friends and alumni on **Wednesday, May 13, 2026** for a wine and cheese reception at the historic Gesu Catholic Church. The evening will feature the history, families, art, and architecture of the parish founded by Jesuits in 1922 and once home to four Detroit mayors, several congressmen and the renowned Fisher Brothers. This event will share rare architectural drawings and antique stained-glass windows design – some dating back to the late 1800s from two Detroit families who long worked with the Jesuits and the Archdiocese of Detroit. The two families behind the firms of Diehl & Diehl Architects and Detroit Stained Glass Works shaped our city's sacred spaces.

Special guests include Paul G. Diehl, grandson of original architect George F. Diehl and descended from the founders of Detroit Stained Glass Works; Patricia Montemurri, award-winning journalist; and Mary Clare McCormick, Detroit Sacred Art archivist.
