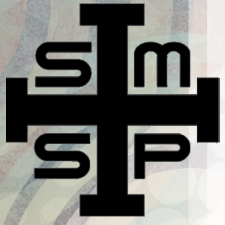

THOUGHTS ON PENTECOST – COMING OUT OF THE UPPER ROOM

“Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” (John 20:21)

On Pentecost Sunday (May 24th) the Church closes out the Easter Season with a fitting celebration. It marks the time when Jesus kept his promise to us. He sends the Holy Spirit to strengthen and motivate his apostles and followers, who were gathered in an upper room in Jerusalem.

God didn't intend for them to stay in hiding, and in fear. They were chosen and formed to go out and be witnesses throughout the world, baptizing people and teaching them about loving and forgiving others. Jesus had already explained this mission to them, but his hideous death left them shocked and paralyzed.

So first, Jesus offers what they need most – “peace.” The risen Lord moves through locked doors to give them this gift of comfort and consolation. It's the kind of peace that surpasses our human imaginations and is there for us, too.

On this “birthday of the Church,” here are a few other thoughts:

“Without Pentecost, Christ's work would have been incomplete. His death proved his love for us. Pentecost, and the gift of the Holy Spirit enables us to follow in his footsteps by putting on his mind and heart.” (Franciscan Author Roland J. Faley)

“When we think of Pentecost, we usually imagine the tongues of fire coming down upon Mary and the apostles. This is definitely a dramatic entrance on the part of the Holy Spirit. But how much do we remember that the Holy Spirit is less about fire and drama, and more about breath and peace?”

Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit on them, much like when the Creator breathed life into Adam. Jesus then tells them to forgive the sins of others. It becomes clear that the Holy Spirit brings forgiveness and peace. No wonder the Holy Spirit is called “the greatest of consolers!”

At our Confirmation, we receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, a gift we aren't meant to keep for ourselves. Peace is some-

thing to be shared. In a world in such need of peace, we can do our part by offering forgiveness and breathing new life into our broken relationships.” (Deacon Josef Rodriguez – published on Jesuitpost.org)

“In John's Gospel, Jesus doesn't give the Holy Spirit to the Apostles individually, but when they're gathered together. Even in our own cases, we can't just baptize and confirm ourselves.

The Trinity itself is a community, bonded by the Spirit, that builds up the Church community, united in the Spirit, and is sent out to bring others into the community, called by the Spirit. Because we don't just exist for God, we exist for each other.” (Fr. Joe Nolla, S.J – published on Jesuitpost.org)

And may we pray together:

Holy Spirit, sent by the Father, ignite in us your holy fire; strengthen your children with the gift of faith, revive your Church with the breath of love, and renew the face of the earth, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

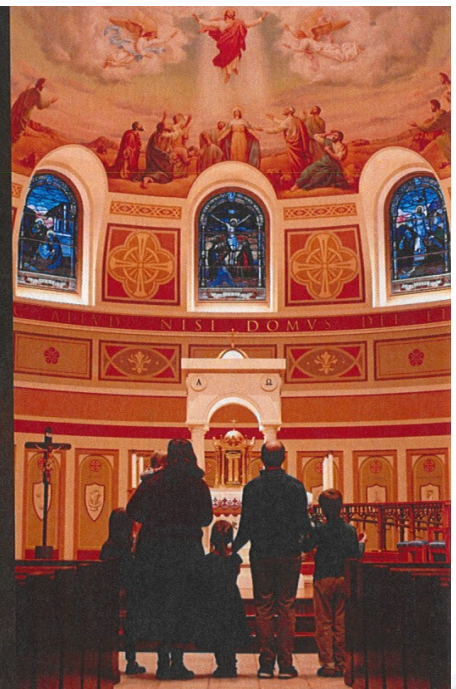
