MIDWEST JESUITS PROVINCE DAYS AND ORDINATIONS

Earlier this month, I had the opportunity to gather with 250 of my fellow Jesuit brothers in Milwaukee for our annual “Province Days” gathering of the USA Midwest Province of the Society of Jesus. There are nearly 400 Midwest Province Jesuits, serving both in the U.S. and around the world. On Friday, June 12th, we began the day with table conversations about what we do well as a province and where the Holy Spirit might be inviting us to change or grow. Then, our provincial, Fr. Karl Kiser, SJ, shared an update about the various ministries of our province, from high school and universities to parishes and retreat centers.

Fr. Kiser concluded his remarks by referencing Pope Leo’s Corpus Christi homily from the Holy Father’s trip to Spain. He explained how Pope Leo called us to “refresh” those we serve from the Eucharistic spring. In his homily, given before the 1.2 million people gathered in the Plaza de Cibeles in Madrid on June 7th, the Roman Pontiff declared, “Let us return to him with sincere love. Let us open ourselves to the encounter with him, let us allow him to quench the thirst of our hearts, so that we may then go forth into the paths of life and history, bringing to the people this stream of fresh water, a stream of love, peace, justice and joy.”

Later, that evening, we celebrated our “jubilarians” who marked significant milestones in their lives as Jesuits and priests, including Fr. Walter Bado, SJ, who has been a Jesuit for 80 years! I actually had the opportunity to have breakfast with Fr. Walt earlier during my stay in Milwaukee. Six Jesuits celebrated 50 years in the priesthood, among whom was Fr. Rick Abert, SJ, who gave the homily during the Mass for the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. He shared a moving story about a friend who was able to reunite with her family several years after being deported. He encouraged us as Jesuits to, “put on the heat of Christ to serve others.”

On Saturday, we celebrated the ordination to the priesthood of nine Midwest Jesuits, including Fr. Nathan Krawetze, SJ, who will be joining our St. Mary

parish staff in mid-July, in the recently renovated Church of Gesu, adjacent to the campus of Marquette University. I was ordained in the same church eight years earlier, so being there brought back many fond memories. Archbishop Jeffrey Grob of Milwaukee was the presider and ordaining prelate. He exhorted those to be ordained to die to themselves in order to live the priesthood of Christ. He concluded his homily by calling all of us to, “Never tire of being on fire with the love of Christ.”

Throughout my time away, I was able to reflect on these first three years as pastor. I am truly blessed to have the privilege to serve in this capacity and am filled with gratitude to God and to all of you for your prayerful support and for your dedication to our parish. The Jesuit Parish Examen team that visited St. Mary back in April likewise shared with me how at St. Mary, “different expressions of faith, devotion, and piety [are] woven together to create something greater,” and how, “especially in a divided world, the unity and community at St. Mary is a gift.” I could not agree more! May God continue to bless our parish community!

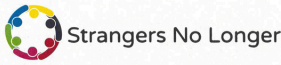

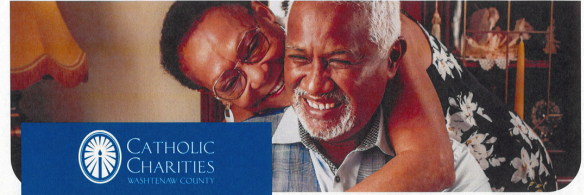
